The traditional holiday of Thanksgiving is celebrated this month. Turkey is the main food consumed on this day. Below are several interesting and informative facts about the turkey.

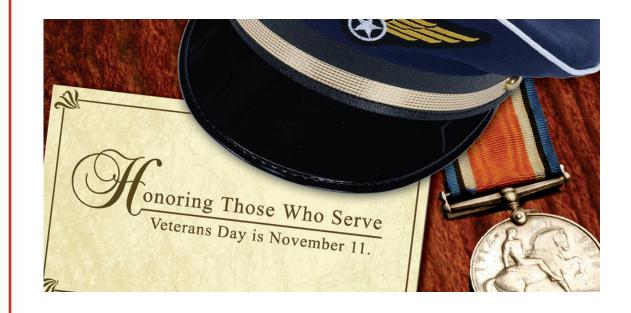
- On average, Americans eat more than 16 pounds of turkey annually.
- The largest turkey on record was 86 pounds.
- A male turkey is a tom, a female is a hen and a newborn is a poult.
- The average mature turkey has about 3,500 feathers.
- A turkey egg takes 28 days to hatch.
- 675 million pounds of turkey will be eaten this coming Thanksgiving in the United States.

- The main farmers of turkey are Minnesota, North Carolina, Arkansas, Virginia and California.
- Turkeys see in color.
- Every year, the president of the United States pardons a turkey for the Thanksgiving holiday.
- Turkey is a great source of protein—30 grams per 3.5 ounces of cooked turkey.
- The first meal ever eaten on the moon was turkey.

The First Thanksgiving

Festivals with the spirit of giving thanks have been common in many cultures, so determining the original Thanksgiving celebration proves difficult. But tradition recognizes the 1621 feast between the Pilgrim settlers at Plymouth Colony and neighboring American Indians as America's first Thanksgiving.

Sailing from England aboard the Mayflower, the Pilgrims arrived in present-day Massachusetts in the fall of 1620, yet remained on the ship for several months. When the colonists moved ashore the following spring, they were visited by two English-speaking Indians, Samoset and Squanto, who showed the Pilgrims how to hunt and grow their own food. Squanto also served as an interpreter and mediator between the settlers and the neighboring Wampanoag tribe.

Sometime between Sept. 21 and Nov. 1, the Pilgrims organized a feast to celebrate the success of their first crop. Around 90 Wampanoag, including Chief Massasoit, joined the colonists for the festivities, which lasted for three days and included games, singing and dancing, in addition to the elaborate meal.

The Pilgrims' records indicate that regional fowl, such as ducks, geese, swans and, yes, probably turkey, were served at the feast, along with venison brought by the Wampanoag. Historians believe that other foods present at the meal included fish and shellfish, beans, onions, porridge made from cornmeal, berries, squash and pumpkin—but no pumpkin pie.

Talking Turkey

For more than 30 years, the experts at the Butterball Turkey Talk-Line have been at the ready, answering home cooks' holiday turkey-related questions. Here's a taste of some of the hotline's most memorable inquiries:

A Talk-Line expert asked a caller what state her turkey was in, meaning how thawed it was. The caller replied, "Florida."

After finding a turkey from 1969 in his father's freezer, a man phoned in requesting tips on how to cook the 30-year-old bird.

A woman called disappointed, wondering why her turkey had no breast meat. The Butterball staffer figured out the caller's turkey was placed upside down on the platter.

A man cut his turkey in half with a chainsaw, then wanted to know if the chain's grease would affect the turkey. November 2016
