

# Our Recommendations for Your Adult Cat's Vaccinations

We recommend cats that are sixteen (16) weeks of age and older with an unknown history of vaccinations receive the following:

## **FVRCCP vaccine**

Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis (herpes virus), Calici virus, Chlamydia, Panleukopenia (feline distemper virus) vaccine  
Give initial FVRCCP vaccine. Booster in four weeks, one year following and then every two years.

## **Rabies vaccine**

Give initial Rabies vaccine. Booster one year following, and then every two years in accordance with West Virginia state law.

## **FeLV/FIV blood test**

With a negative test status, give initial **FeLV vaccine**.  
Booster **FeLV vaccine** in four weeks, and then annually in accordance with your cat's life style.

## **Feline Bordetella vaccine**

Give initial Feline Bordetella vaccine; booster annually.

## **Heartworm preventative medication**

Provide oral or topical heartworm preventative medication on a once monthly year-round basis.

## **Microscopic stool examination**

In order to prevent the transmission of zoonotic diseases, the Centers for Disease Control recommends that a microscopic stool examination be performed on your adult cat every 6 months, and antihelmintic (dewormer) medication be provided even if the microscopic examination is negative for parasitic ova (eggs) or larvae.
