Your Kitten's Vaccinations

<u>Age</u>	<u>Vaccinations/Diagnostic tests</u>
6-8 weeks	<p><u>FVRCCP vaccine</u> Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis (herpes virus), Calici virus, Chlamydia, Panleukopenia (feline distemper virus) vaccine</p> <p>Microscopic stool examination and deworming.</p>
10-12 weeks	<p><u>FVRCCP vaccine</u> Booster one year following, and then every two years.</p> <p><u>Rabies vaccine</u> Booster one year following, and then every two years.</p> <p><u>FeLV/FIV blood test</u> Feline Leukemia Virus/Feline Immunosuppressive Virus blood test.</p> <p>With a negative FeLV/FIV test status, give initial <u>FeLV vaccine</u>. If your kitten has been tested prior to 10 weeks of age, a follow-up blood test is recommended.</p> <p>Provide oral or topical heartworm preventative medication, and provide on a once monthly year-round basis.</p> <p>Microscopic stool examination and deworming.</p>
14-16 weeks	<p><u>FeLV vaccine</u> Booster annually in accordance with your pet's life style.</p> <p><u>Feline Bordetella vaccine</u> Booster annually.</p> <p>Microscopic stool examination and deworming</p>
