Fabulous Flag Day Facts

Test your knowledge of our flag and Flag Day with these fun questions.

1. The original American flag was adopted in 1777. How many times has it changed since then?

A: The design has been changed 28 times; the last alteration was in 1959 when the 50th star was added for Hawaii.

2. How many stripes does the flag have and why?

A: The American flag has 13 stripes, alternating red and white. There's one stripe for each of the original 13 colonies.

3. Does the original flag still exist?

A: Yes, it's in the Smithsonian Institution.

4. Francis Scott Key wrote the poem that became our national anthem. When did he write it?

A: He wrote it on September 14, 1814, the morning after the shelling of Fort McHenry during the Battle of Baltimore in the War of 1812.

5. When did Key's poem "The Star-Spangled Banner" become the U.S. national anthem?

A: It was adopted by a Congressional resolution signed by President Herbert Hoover in 1931.

6. Thanks to the space program, how many American flags are on the moon?

A: There are six flags on the moon.

7. Who can order flags to be flown at half-staff?

A: Only the president, state governors, and the mayor of Washington, D.C.

8. Who was honored for cutting the American flag into pieces?

A: Admiral Robert Peary cut up an American flag and left pieces of it scattered at the North Pole.

9. When is it appropriate to fly the flag upside down?

A: Only in a dire emergency. It means "Send help immediately."

10. What is a vexillologist?

A: An expert in the history of flags.

O Say Can You See

June 14 is Flag Day in the United States, a day commemorating the adoption of the American flag by the Second Continental Congress in 1777. Known as "Old Glory," "Stars and Stripes," and the "Star-Spangled Banner," the flag has 13 equal horizontal stripes, alternating red and white, symbolizing the original thirteen colonies. The *canton*, the rectangle in the upper left-hand corner, is blue with 50 white stars, representing the 50 states, alternating in numbers of six and five per row. Throughout America's history, there have been 39 different flag designs, with the stars of the canton changing each time a state was added to the Union. Canton designs, before the 48-star flag, had no official arrangement of the stars. Sometimes they were in a circular pattern and other times in the pattern of a star. Since 1777, one thing hasn't changed: the American flag has always stood for freedom.
