

DATAOPS: LET YOUR DATA REACH ITS FULL POTENTIAL


As enterprises expect more from their data, simply collecting it isn't enough.

THE CHALLENGE

As the data operations manager of any data-driven enterprise will tell you, your data is only as good as the tools you use to collect and analyze it. Even then, it must be able to drive an action that will in some way translate to greater operational efficiency and higher profitability.

In practice, extracting this type of business value from large volumes of data is often complex and time-consuming. However, while big data platforms do a great job of collecting data, it's historical data only, which ends up in disparate silos across an enterprise, making it difficult to share and create meaningful connections. Unfortunately, big data platforms are unable to merge both, effectively resulting in incomplete answers.

Big data platforms are hardly known for their analysis capabilities. They're limited in their ability to apply sufficient context or intelligence to the collected historical data so that it can be used to its full potential.



It's important to point out that big data platforms were built to be data-collecting workhorses, not analysis rock stars. But enterprises should understand that collecting is only the first step in deriving business value from data.

With this in mind, enterprises are discovering the value of DataOps, the methodology that aligns management of data with the goals intended for that data. Just as DevOps improves coordination between developers and the operations team, DataOps connects everyone who handles data. It democratizes data, breaking down system and team silos and automating data infrastructure. The result is data from disparate sources and pipelines delivered at the "speed of need," shared across teams and departments.

Applying AI to DataOps provides a path forward to creating a data insights-driven enterprise. So, while DataOps breaks down the barriers to accelerated data-sharing across an enterprise, AI ensures connections are made with that data — both historical and real-time data — and sets it up so that actions can be taken to move the ball forward.


