There's a definite Pop Art sensibility to Atrafloor's new Floral collection. Patterson is helping her customers to do the same with the launch of a space in Brooklyn, New York, which opened its doors on Valentine's Day. Fox Fodder Farm, named after Patterson's family farm in Delaware, offers a range of locally sourced buds that can be bought individually or in bunches, along with her eye-catching and architectural bouquets, which regularly appear in the boutiques of Carolina Herrera and Ulla Johnson. And if you're not in the neighborhood, you can, of course, order a bouquet online, or subscribe so that your vases are never empty. The subscription service, says Patterson, "allows us to customize the flowers to our clients' tastes and to curate their space. #### TALES OF THE CITY

Enamored by the awe-inspiring architecture, vibrant flora, and beguiling culture of Seville, heritage British brand Cole & Son has taken inspiration from the city for its new range of bold and beautiful wallpapers. The Andalusian capital's Phoenician, Roman, Islamic, and Christian influences are visible in the intricate patterns on the walls of Mudéjar palaces and the gothic design of the cathedral. Such diversity is reflected in this eclectic collection, which features 17 designs that take in everything from flower-strewn trompe l'oeil balconies bursting with color, to tile-inspired geometric motifs, and flamenco dancers radiating the passion of Spain's musical heritage. There's even the option of recreating the palace gardens of the 13th-century Royal Alcázar of Seville, a stylized wonder in which peacocks and emerald-hued parrots make the manicured grounds their playground, offering an Iberian paradise anywhere in the world. cole-and-son.com

### SINGULAR VISION

Dame Zaha Hadid rewrote the rulebook with her amorphous, otherworldly architecture. An updated monograph of Philip Jodidio's sumptuous book Zaha Hadid: Complete Works 1979-Today, released by art specialists Taschen, is a stunning visual history of the late Iraqi-British artist's work, taking in her iconic buildings alongside her furniture and interior designs. With beautiful photography, exhaustive texts, and Hadid's own neo-futuristic drawings, it's a fitting tribute.





## Starting point

Henrybuilt has made its name designing and installing kitchens and wardrobes for design-conscious clients across the United States. The company has now created its first range of standalone shelving, armoires, vanities, and consoles, as well as tables and seating. The Primary Objects collection comprises the uncomplicated and functional essentials around which any room is created. For the kitchen, there's the customizable Shadow Box-a tall, larder-style cupboard with six panes of tinted glass in its doors—while bathroom essentials include the Puddle Jumper double vanity, and the Icicle, "a floating sliver of a medicine cabinet." ## **GOOD-LOOKING GLASS**

An oversized mirror can also be an artwork if positioned cleverly. A case in point is the six-foot (1.8 m) Simple Mirror by Kalon, which has an oil-rubbed, hardwood frame and can be hung in two orientations or casually leant against a wall. Available in American Ash or American Black Walnut, each piece is produced by a small team of traditional craftspeople in New England using timber sourced from local, sustainably managed forests. ## Power of three

Using skills honed over three generations, Blackbird Bespoke takes commissions for one-off handcrafted metal furniture pieces, as well making its own lighting, mirrors, tables, and seating. A recent addition to its offering is this Triple Discus table light—so called because the circular steel components resemble the ancient metal discus. It is part of a collection that was designed to be both distinctive and dramatic, and to fit equally well into modern or period interiors.
