A Special Abode

≡ Biblical Base: John 14:1-3, Revelation 21; 22:1-3; Matthew 24:27.

≡ Main lesson: God is preparing a dwelling place for you in heaven.

≡ Story: The Heavenly City.

≡ Objectives

That children may:

- Want to prepare for the second coming and go to live with our Lord.
- Know about the city that God is preparing for us.

≡ Memory verse: John 14:2.

≡ Introduction

Talk about the different types of houses that exist. Show examples in photos.

≡ Lesson

Story	Unifying Phrase	Life of the Child
John 14:1-3. Jesus told the disciples not to be scared now that he would not be there anymore. He told them that He was going to prepare a place in heaven to go live so that we could come live with him there.	And you... But.....	Are you scared like the disciples were? Would you like to go live with the Lord in heaven? We have the promise assured that He is preparing us a city there so that we can go and live together.
How will that city be? There will be a tabernacle of God with man. There will be no more death, nor crying, nor pain. It will be a city with the glory of God like a most precious diamond. There will be a big and tall wall with twelve gates that have twelve angels. They will be adorned with precious stones. A clean river, as crystals, will run from the throne of God. There will be a street, and a tree of life with fruits, and leaves of healing.	How Marvelous!	Would you like to go live in that city? We cannot imagine how beautiful it will be.

<p>Saul answered the voice of God and said, "What do you want me to do?" Then the Lord answered and said: Get up and go into the city, and you will be told what to do.</p> <p>God ordered him to go to a specific place in the city. So, when Saul stood up, he could no longer see.... but he was obedient and went where he was told to go. Acts 9:6-9</p>		<p>Have you accepted God's call? Revelation 3:20. The Lord wants you to accept his call. Continue walking by His side.</p>
<p>God appeared to the prophet and told him to go see Saul....He said that he would become his instrument. So the prophet went and put his hands on Saul, and immediately Saul could see again. He got up and ate. He then stayed with the disciples a few more days, and from then on, he always followed the Lord, becoming a great servant of God.</p>		<p>Psalms 51:7. The Lord cleans us. We can walk with God every day. Talk about what we should do. Accept his call. Repent of our sins. Obey what His word says. Talk with Him through prayer every day. Have communion with Him. Listen to Him word in Bible class every day.</p>

Optional Activities

Give the children a picture of a child walking with Jesus. Let them color it.
On the blank lines at the bottom, let the children write: "Today I have decided:....."

Craft of the day

Make a card with the kids to remember the day that they decided to walk with the Lord.

Conclusion: Dear God, thank you for giving me the opportunity to walk by your side.

Bible Lesson # 1

Salvation

Biblical Base: John 3:16, Psalms 68:19, Psalms 104:24, Psalms 116:12, Romans 3:23, Romans 6:23, Romans 5:8.

Main lesson: God wants to give you salvation.

Story: A poorly spoken child is saved.

Objectives

That the children may:

- Know that God has a plan to save us.
- Understand that God gave us His son to die for us.
- Accept the salvation that God offers them.

Memory Verse: John 3:16

Introduction

Look for some element that contains the story (for example, a wagon, a nurse's apron, a flashlight, a backpack) to use it as an initiative for the lesson.

Example 1

Hello children, how are you? Look what I brought you: a little wagon!

This type of transportation is used in some places. It's horse-drawn, and can reach a medium speed.

Today I'll tell you a story where you're going to see what happened to a wagon like this.

<p>A group of people made a home for children on the streets. They would go out at night to walk through the public streets to get these children and save them from evil ways.</p>	<p>You know what? Lets continue with our story....</p>	<p>God's love is like the love that these people shared. God is concerned for all of humanity. He has given us a beautiful place to live, with trees....(Name some of the benefits God grants us according to what you have seen the kids with) Psalms 68:19</p>	<p>Group of People. Landscape of nature</p>

A child was living without a home or family. He didn't have a family, so his life was sad. He was used to doing bad things. He would hit kids for fun, scare the elderly, lie, steal not only when he needed something but also for fun. He was part of a small group of thief kids. Every night they would gather to break into a house.	And you.... But, what happened?	Are you similar to this child? Do you do bad things too? You know what? We are like this child...we lie, steal, fight, say bad words, we are gossipers. All the bad things we say or do are called sin. Romans 3:23 What sadness! We have all sinned and are far from God. We can no longer be the children of God Romans 6:23	Street children. Children stealing. Written words: fighting, lying, stealing, gossiping, bad words. Big heart.
He was waiting for his friends. A man strongly touches his shoulder and tells him to go home to sleep. The child tells him that he doesn't have any place to sleep. The man offers him a place to sleep.	A short silence. The child from the story.	God also remembered us. Even though we are sinners, He gave us a solution so that we can save ourselves. God gave His son Jesus to come to earth and give His life for each sinner. Romans 5:8	Adult man touches the shoulder of a child. Bed, food.
The child reached the indicated house, they let him in, and there he had a clean place to sleep and eat. In the morning when he leaves he has an accident and ends up in the hospital. He talked a lot about John 3:16, and was told its meaning.	You know what?	Jesus died on the cross for you and me. He died in our place. But now we have to believe. If we believe in the sacrifice of Jesus for us, then we will have eternal life. Do you believe that Jesus died for you?	Big door. Accident. Hospital. A red cross with the word Jesus on it.
The words of love and comfort penetrated his ears for the first time. The child in the story decided to change his life forever. After several days, the child fully recovered. He helped all the sick in the hospital by sharing words of courage with them. Then he met with the friends from the hostel who brought him to a Christian home so that he could go to school. After a few years he became a great preacher.		John 3:16 is a gift for you today. It is a marvelous promise for your life. And you? Do you also want to accept what God tells you? He has given you the solution for your life just as it was given to this small child. He has given you his son, Jesus, to die on the cross of Calvary for you! He died long ago so that you may have life. He died in your place and gave his life for every sinner. And even though he never committed sin and bad things, he died so that each one of us may live. What is your decision today? Will you continue as you are?	Child speaking by hospital bedsides. White heart. Child.

Optional activity

Picture with the Bible verse

Conclusion: Thank you Father, for letting Jesus die on the cross for me.

Games: Chair games, game about the handrail

Bible Lesson N#6

Walk by my Side

Biblical Base: Acts 9:1-31, Psalm 51:7, John 3:36, Revelation 3:20.

Main lesson: God tells you to walk by His side.

Story: Calling of Paul.

Objectives

That children may:

- Understand that God wants them to walk beside Him.
- Learn how we can walk next to Jesus.
- Wish to walk with Jesus every day.

Memory verse: Psalm 51:7.

Introduction

Blind game. Cover the eyes of a child and allow them to walk for a moment without seeing anything. Make sure they do not see, but are careful enough not to fall.

Lesson

Story	Unifying Phrase	Life of the Child
Saul was very obedient and faithful to what he believed. He worked for the priests. He would send out letters to other cities persecuting the Christians. He would look for them on the roadsides and cities, and then he would take them to Jerusalem as prisoners. Acts 9:1-2	You know what? Let us return to the story.	Each one of us has a life, and we may think that everything we do is right/correct. What do you do every day.
When Saul was on the way to the city of Damascus, a light suddenly surrounded him. He fell on his knees and then heard a voice which said, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?" Acts 9:3-5	And you..... What happened with Saul?	Maybe a light didn't appear to you, but you've heard about what God did for us by giving Jesus to die for us. John 3:36...explain what we have to choose

Jesus died on a cross beside two thieves. After His death, He was put in a tomb, but on the third day He resurrected, and now lives!		John 10:17-18. He gave His life for us, and now lives again. We now have a beautiful promise. 1 John 1:7. If we go to the light, then we will have communion one with the other, (because He is in the light), and the blood of Jesus Christ will cleanse us of all sin.	Cross Children by Jesus.

Optional

Divide a paper into two equal parts.

The children will draw pictures on each side of the halves.

On one side, they will draw what Jesus did for each one of us, and on the other side they will draw what happened after the death of Jesus.

Craft of the day

Paste pieces of paper into the figure of children praying, to make a picture for their homes. Make a small frame for the drawing.

Conclusion: Thank you, Lord, for giving us a Savior.

Bible Lesson # 2

Children of God

Biblical Base: 2 Samuel 4:4; 9:1-13, Romans 5:8, Jeremiah 31:3, Romans 3:23, Romans 5:8, John 1:12.

Main Lesson: God wants you to be His son.

Story: Mephibosheth.

Objectives

That children may:

- Believe that God is our Father.
- Be willing to accept Jesus as their only Savior.
- Accept being children of God

Memory Verse: John 1:12

Introduction

Bring a crutch and show it to the children. Talk to them about its different uses, and why there are people who need to use it. Today we will study about a boy who used one of these.

Lesson:

Story	Unifying Phrase	Life of the Child	Illustrations
Mephibosheth lived in the palace because he was a grandchild of King Saul. He had all he wanted: toys, food, and people who were dedicated to caring for him each day.	You know what? Lets continue with the story.	We do not live in a palace, but God has given us many things for our benefit and we should be grateful for it....food, friends, parents, (talk about how God loves us) Jeremiah 31:3.	Palace. A Child. Toys. Pictures of food. Friends. Parents. Make a poster that says "God loves me".
One day, news arrived that the king died, and that the enemies were coming to kill everyone that was left in the palace. Mephibosheth's nanny left running with him but fell while carrying him. As he fell, Mephibosheth broke both legs, becoming invalid forever.	Poor Mephibosheth! What happened with Mephibosheth?	Mephibosheth became paralyzed forever, he would never walk again. We are not paralyzed but are full of evil. Romans 3:23. Our sins separate us from God.	Messenger. Nanny. A child with broken legs. A picture of children fighting, lying, etc. White stained heart.

David assumes the throne and remembers his friendship with Jonathan. He calls the guards and asks: Is there anyone left of the house of Saul? Siba tells him that he knows of someone and King David sends for him.	How beautiful! So what happened to Mephibosheth?	God also remembered us, and sent us His son Jesus to give His life for us. Romans 5:8. Make a review with the kids to remind them why Jesus came to this world.	David. Soldiers. Siba. Red Cross.
Mephibosheth arrives at the palace. David receives him and invites him to live in the palace forever. Mephibosheth receives the properties that belonged to his father.	Marvelous!	God gives us a special invitation today. He calls us to accept Him as our Savior. He wants us to be His children forever. Let us accept the command of the Lord and decide to always be the children of God. John 1:12	White Heart. Heart that says: "Son of God". Mephibosheth with David.

Optional activity

Name the steps of Salvation with the kids

- » God loves us
- » I'm a sinner
- » Christ died for me
- » I receive Him in my heart
- » I'm saved

≡ Craft of the day

Make a cube with the drawings that represent the different parts of salvation. Prepare the outline of how to make a cube beforehand. The kids will draw something that represents a part of salvation on each side of the cube

- » Love of God. (Something from creation)
- » I'm a sinner. (A heart with words such as: lying, bad words, etc...written on it).
- » Christ died for me. (A cross)
- » I receive him. (A white heart)
- » Eternal life. (It can be a drawing of the second coming of Christ, or of heaven).

After the activity you may allow the kids to talk about what it means.

≡ Conclusion: Thank you Lord for being my Father and I your son.

≡ Bible Lesson N#5

A Solution for Man

≡ **Biblical base: Isaiah 53:6, 1 John 1:7, John 10:17-18, 1 Peter 2:24, John 18, 19, 20.**

≡ **Main lesson: God sent His son to save you.**

≡ **Story: Death of Jesus.**

≡ Objectives

That children may:

- Know the story of the death of Jesus.
- Understand the sacrifice of Jesus.
- Accept the sacrifice of Jesus.

≡ **Memory verse: Isaiah 53:6**

≡ Introduction

Carry items like nails, a crown of thorns, or other things that were used in the death of Jesus. Another option is to start talking about the different ways of dying.

≡ Lesson

Story	Unifying Phrase	Life of the Child	Illustrations
Jesus had dinner with all of his disciples in an upper chamber. Then he left to the Mount of Olives. One of His disciples appeared and betrayed him.	You know what?	It is difficult to understand Judas. But, how many times do we do the same...we accuse a friend in front of the teachers before talking to him first. Jesus did not commit any sin, and yet, they were giving His to His enemies. They only wanted the death of Jesus. Isaiah 53:6	Jesus in the upper chamber. Mount of Olives. Judas. A child accusing a friend.
Jesus was brought before the authorities, and even though they didn't find any fault in him, they still wanted to kill him.		We, unlike Jesus, have committed faults, and deserve death. But Jesus did not fail. 1 Peter 2:24.	Jesus brought before the Sanhedrin. People screaming. Pilate washing his hands. Children. Empty cross.

Optional Activities:

Give everyone a paper and pencil. Let every student write the sins that they have committed on that piece of paper (without letting anyone else see it). Then throw the paper all together in a fire or place where they can be burned. Pray asking the Lord for forgiveness of all the sins we have committed and pleading for help so that we don't commit them again.

Explain how the Lord forgets our faults.

Craft of the Day:

Write the memory verse in the picture, and color it.

Conclusion: Thank you, God, for forgiving me even though I am a sinner.

An Incomparable Love

Biblical Base: Creation. Genesis 1-3; 2:1-5, John 8:12, Isaiah 43:1, John 14:1-3, Revelation 21:21, Revelation 21:4.

Main Lesson: God wants to show you His love.

Story: Creation.

Objectives

That children may:

- Understand God's love
- Understand how great God's love for us is
- Be sure that God loves us.

Memory verse: Jeremiah 31:3.

Introduction

Cover the eyes of two children. Sit them down on chairs and let them guess the name of a flower by showing them its scent. Do the same thing with some fruits, letting the children touch them and taste them. Today we will study about how God made these things.
