
This is a super easy change that can have a huge impact. It's important to keep it clear and reduce the number of steps required of them to contact you.

- Display contact information on the header or footer of all pages.
- Make sure your info is complete and correct.
- List more than just one way to contact you. Have an e-mail address, mailing address (if at all possible) and list a phone number.
- DONT just have a contact form.
- If you have a contact form, just collect the bare minimum amount of information and do not make fields mandatory.
- Use "yourname@yourwebsite.com" for the e-mail address rather than "info" or "admin" to make it more personal.

2. Make sure information is bite size and intuitive. People have a limited attention span when it comes to looking at websites. Don't waste any of that precious attention making them work to figure out your website.

- Don't have too many menu options. No more than 4-8 items on the menu bar with drop downs.
- Make sure the navigation bar that is consistent across all pages.
- Don't make changes to the menu bar too often.
- Keep the navigation bar at top of the website not bottom.
- Don't try to be clever with naming structures and page arrangement be clear.
- Your logo should link back to your home page and have a 'home' tab in your navigation bar.
- Construct your navigation bar so it makes sense in the order they would go through your site. Contact tab should be last.
- Choose your page names carefully. Don't be vague or leave any room for people to question what is on a page.





3. Make sure your social media is properly integrated.

- Widgets all link to your actual social media profile (not just a like button).
- Make sure links are all working and correct.


4. Secure your investment. Protect your site by taking the necessary security measures to protect your website from hackers.

- Use maximally strong passwords. Upper & lower case letters with numbers and special characters
- Don't use the same password across the board for your sites.
- Change your wordpress username from 'admin' to something else.
- Make sure you run updates regularly and update your themes monthly.
- Use some sort of malware scanning software.

5. Backup regularly. If you have a self hosted website, you need a third party back up solution in place.

- It doesn't matter whether or not you accept credit cards on your site, everyone is susceptible to hackers so having a back up is essential.
- Don't assume you are protected.

Action Steps Checklist:

- Set aside time to do an audit of your site
- Make a list of all the changes you think are necessary
- Ask someone who is not in your line of business to review your site and ask for feedback on navigation, clarity, and user experience
- Add any additional changes to your list
- Make the changes yourself or ask your web developer to make the updates
- Make sure your plug-ins and theme is up to date (if on Wordpress)
- Verify your passwords are maximally complex
- Set up a backup system for regular site back ups
- Run malware scanning software
