

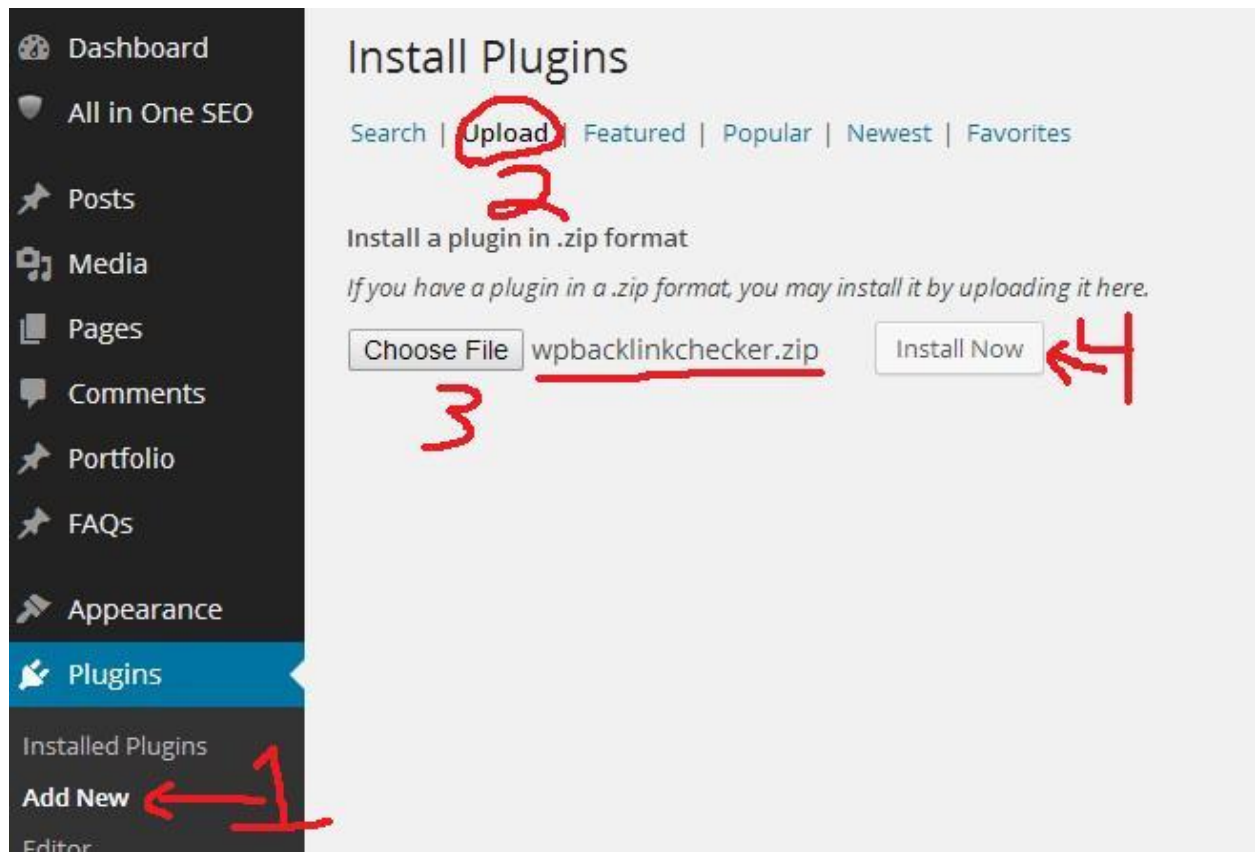
# HOW TO SETUP & USE WP BACKLINK CHECKER

This is a very easy to use backlink checker plugin for WordPress. You must have WordPress setup to be able to use this plugin.

Here are the steps to get started:

## Install & Setup Plugin

Log into your wp-admin panel, go to plugins and upload the wp backlink checker plugin zip file called wpbacklinkchecker.zip.



*\*If uploading doesn't work with your browser, use FTP and upload the wpbacklinkchecker folder inside the zip file to your Plugins directory. Then activate it.*

After, uploading the plugin successfully, go ahead and activate it.



2) After activating, The first thing you should do is go to the “Settings” inside WP Backlink Checker menu.

Cron Setting

You cron line is `php /home/.../public_html/wp-content/plugins/wpbacklinkchecker/wpbc-cron.php > /dev/null`

Please add it to the cpanel cron settings and set the cron to execute once daily for best results

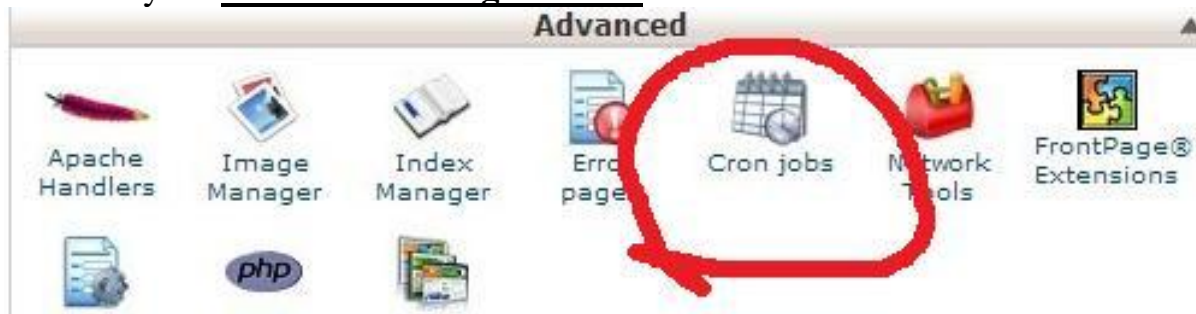


Add in your email address to receive the backlink notifications such as when the backlink is not found anymore or anchor texts are changed.

Then copy the CRON command line and you must paste this to the cron jobs from inside of your **CPANEL hosting account**.



Make sure to run this cron job 1 time every day like this:


#### Add New Cron Job

## Adding Backlinks to Monitor

Now you are ready to setup a backlink group. Go to backlink checker, and at the top right click to “add group”.

Now just add a group name, this can be anything you want. The purpose is to just keep your links organized. For example, you can have 1 group for all of your paid backlinks, and another group for all of your free backlinks or whatever.

\* The option for “remind me to renew this group backlinks”, this is a reminder email to renew your backlinks. For example, if you purchase your backlinks from another website for 30 days, this plugin will notify you in 30 days that you should renew your backlinks for this group.

After you have your backlink group setup, then add in the backlinks to be monitored.

### Add Backlinks

*\*Site to check, is the URL to the page where your backlinks can be found from. If you bought a text link or banner from another website, then add it here.*

*“Expected anchor text” is obviously the anchor text of your backlink.*  
*\*To monitor banner backlinks, leave the anchor text blank.*

That’s All! You can add as many backlinks to be monitored as you like.
