First Bobcat of the Season

This year marks the 11th consecutive year of Bobcat GPS research on Kiawah Island. Bobcats trapping for the 2017 season began on January 25th and is ongoing. Biologists captured the first bobcat of the season on February 15th. Bobcat 850 (Male) weighing in at 15lb 11oz was found close to Parkside Villas. Recycling and Overflow Trash Stations

For the convenience of our residents, the Town has two recycling/overflow trash stations located on Kestrel Court and behind Town Hall on Beachwalker Dr. Both locations are open at all times and lighted for evening use. Both locations accept the following materials: Recycling Material, Household Trash and Recycled Cardboard.

Electronic items such as televisions are prohibited from being disposed of at these stations. These areas are monitored by cameras and it is illegal to place any debris or items on the ground, or outside of the containers. If containers are full at both locations please wait and return once they have been emptied. Remember: It is illegal, by Town Ordinance, 15-212 to deposit, discard, dump or dispose of litter upon any public or private property. Those found in violation will be prosecuted.

Solid Waste Notices **Brown Trash & Hazardous Waste: Friday, March 3rd**

What classifies as Brown Trash?

Lawn chairs, grills, toasters, lamps, small microwaves, computers, printers, folding or beach chairs, mattresses, box springs, bicycles, strollers. All brown trash must be placed on the curb by 7:00 a.m. to ensure collection.

What classifies as Hazardous Waste?

Household chemicals, garden chemicals, home workshop chemicals, used motor oil, oil filters, old gasoline, gas & oil mix, antifreeze, paint and paint remover, varnish, pesticides. Hazardous waste should be brought to the Town Hall garage (21 Beachwalker Drive) for disposal between the hours of 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
