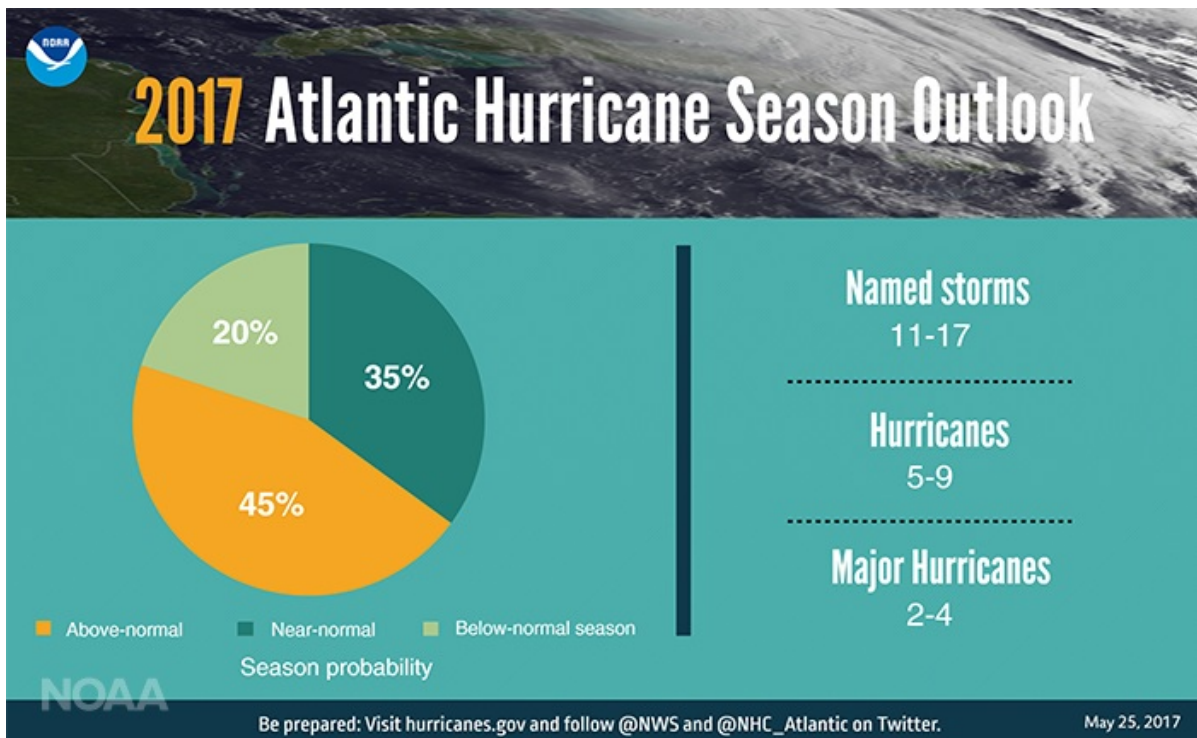

Kiawah's Leash Law Explained

The leash laws for pets on Kiawah Island are defined in 2 sections of the Town's municipal code. A summary of each section is provided below. The complete sections can be viewed [here](#).



Section 7-201

Pets must be leashed at all times when they are outside unless they are in an enclosed area (pen, fence, etc.). The only exceptions to this rule are listed in Section 16-502.

Section 16-502

Dog Use Area: Pets may be unleashed (must be under control) year round from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. in the Dog Use area located between the Beach Club and the Ocean Course Clubhouse. **Pets must be leashed in this area from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.**

Remainder of Beach: March 16 - October 31: Pets must be on leash
November 1 - March 15: Pets may be unleashed (must be under control) from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. **Pets must be leashed from 7 p.m. - 7 a.m.**

Critical Habitat Areas: Pets cannot enter critical habitat areas located on each end of the island and marked with signage.

Notification Alerts:

[Sign up for the Town's emergency notification system CodeRED.](#) CodeRED is used to communicate to residents in emergency situations or critical community alerts such as evacuation notices, boil water notices, tornado warnings, and flash flood notices.

- Storms that form north of the equator spin counterclockwise. Storms south of the equator spin clockwise. This difference is because of Earth's rotation on its axis.
