#### GERMANY: HORST HARFELIM

There seem to be some questions of couron interest concerning der-many, which I should like to answer in this and the following is-sues of the SERIMARIAN. This time I will try to explain to you how the E.K.D., the Evangelische Firche in

Deutschland, is constituted,
The E.K.D. is a federation of
all German "Land.skirchen" ( state
churches), both Lutheran and Heformed. The state churches are either Lutheran, United ("United" churches are those, whose constitutions permit both, Lutheran and Reformed confession for individual members and for congregations in their area.) or Reformed. Most of them cover the same geographical area as the states. The cause for this structure was the right of every prince to decide which religion his principality should have. Until 1918 the princes were also the supreme bishops of the protestant state churches. When after World Mar I the rinces had to abdicate, the Landeskirchen became independent with their cum church government and their wan church assembly, elected from the congregations. But nevertheless the name "Landeskirchen" remained and is now very misleading, because "Isand" means nothing else than the goographical location of the respective church. These churches are as tive church. These churches are as independent from the state as the American Churches. In some respects the separation between church and state might even be sharper . For instance you do not find flags in German churches; and the state drafted the ministerial students and ministers as well as everybody else. However, the state provides the right for the Roman Catholic Church and for the Protestant Landeskirchen to install religious instructors in public schools. The classes are usually divided Into tow sections, Protestant and Catholic, and it is up to the parents whether they want their children to attend these classes.

So the Landeskirchen are neither churches which are tied to the state nor are they "denominations" in the common sense of the word, because most of them do no emphasize any differences. Nevertheless there are still some strictly Initheran churches in northern and central Germany and in Bavaria, although you will probably find no where in the Germany of today such

This is centainly due to the common steregie of the church in Germany against the Wart regime, which brought all Garistians closer together. Therefore in my own Landeskirche as well as in some others the church governments do not care about where a ministerial student has studied. Whether he attended a more Reformed university - like Basel - or a more Lutheran university - like Erlangen - is not considered when it comes to his ordi-metion. although these Landeskirch-en have Lutheran constitutions. Then, of course, there are United Churches, especially in Frussia and the Rhineland, which are Lutheran and Reformed and , last but not least, there are some churches, which are Reformed according to their constitution. As already mentioned, however, the majority of all Protestant Christians in Germany today have a "united" attitude. This makes it possible that all the different Landeskirchen together form one church, the E.K.D., of thousands of Chmittians, gathering from all over Germany to the "Doutsche Evangelische Kirchentag" (meeting of the German Evangelical Church).
