Chapel worship services on Tuesday and Wednesday will

AIDS to help us better understand AIDS and its impact.

SELF-STUDY UPDATE

The second comprehensive draft of the Seminary's Self-Study Report has been undergoing various reviews in the community. The faculty as a whole has met twice to review the draft. The Board of Trustees considered the draft in its standing committees and plenary business meeting earlier this month. The self-study committees have also been meeting to give the draft further review.

The third comprehensive draft will incorporate the revisions suggested by these reviews. This draft will be completed around December 1. The summary of major recommendations in the report will be distributed to the entire Seminary community in early December; copies of the complete report (approximately 150 pages plus appendices) will be available for any interested persons in the development office.

The self-study steering committee (aka Institutional Planning Committee) is holding an open forum for the Seminary community to discuss the findings and recommendations of the self-study on December 9 at 11:10 a.m. in the Bricker Room. This will be an agenda item during the regularly scheduled Seminarian Community Council meeting. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Any final corrections to the third comprehensive draft will be completed by December 8, at which time the report goes to press in order to be mailed in a timely fashion to the Association of Theological Schools and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools of the Commission for Higher Education, at least 60 days in advance of our visitation from the review team February 20 to 23, 1994.

AAR/SBL MEETS IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

The annual joint meeting of the American Academy of Religion (AAR) and the Society for Biblical Literature (SBL) will be held in Washington, D.C., from November 19 through 22. Since the meeting is being held so close to the Lancaster campus, there is a special opportunity for Seminary students to attend. Registration costs for students are low, and students can attend a one-day session if they wish. A full listing of presentations and registration information are available in the Dean's Office.

STAFFORD LOAN INFORMATION

To improve our understanding of ongoing procedures and changes as they affect lenders and students, Ann Schoup has made arrangements for two representatives of the Fulton Bank to meet with students from noon to 1:00 p.m. in the Glatfelter Room on Tuesday, November 30. The representatives are Paul Jones, Input Manager of Loan Accounting, and Dawn Upton, Student Loan Official.

The presentation will include a review of the types of loans available, the relationship between the borrower and the lender, forms that have changed or will change, problems to watch for, default, interest capitalization, loan consolidation and other pertinent matters.

Record the date, time and place on your calendar and plan to participate in this educational student loan update. Since we are meeting over the lunch hour, feel free to bring your lunch with you.





FOX-GENOVESE TO SPEAK AT GETTYSBURG COLLEGE

Leading feminist speaker Dr. Elizabeth Fox-Genovese will present the 32nd annual Fortenbaugh Memorial Lecture at Gettysburg College on Friday, November 19 at 8:00 p.m. in the College Union Building. Fox-Genovese, who is the Eleonore Raoul Professor of the Humanities and the director of women's students at Emory University, will deliver a lecture titled, "To Be Worthy of God's Favor: Southern Women's Defense and Critiques of Slavery." She has written several books, including Within the Plantation Household: Black and White Women of the Old South, which was named outstanding book of the year by the Gustavus Myer Center for the Study of Human Rights.
