This spring, Lancaster Seminary enjoys the unique privilege of hosting not one, but two, "international" pastors-in-residence. Both rived the week of January 30, and will be living among us on campus through the Spring 2006 semester.

The Reverend Margot Runge, a native of Germany, was ordained in 1990 in Weissenfels (Evangelische Kirche der Kirchenprovinz Sachsen, Union of Evangelical Churches) where she served until 1998. Since 1999, she has been serving parishes in Sangerhausen, where she is currently engaged in study of feminist theology and speaks on women of the bible. She received a preaching award in 2004 based on Mark 2:1-12. She has expressed an interest in and curiosity about feminist theology in America. The Reverend Hugh Graham is from London, England, and was ordained in 1994 by the United Reformed Church in the United Kingdom, a sister church of the UCC. Students and staff now have access to NetLibrary eBooks - Hundreds of titles are immediately available to students and employees. NetLibrary, a division of OCLC Online Computer Library Center, is a leading provider of eBooks - and a growing collection of eContent - to libraries worldwide. Library patrons may access NetLibrary eBooks via the library Web site http://library.lts.org. eBooks are full-text electronic versions of published books that library patrons can search, borrow, read and return over the Internet. Search technology allows users to quickly search the entire eBook collection for authors, titles or keywords. NetLibrary eBook collections range in scope from best-selling fiction and foreign language titles to core academic areas of science, social sciences and the humanities to collections of specialized study in areas such as business, education, library science, medicine, religion and philosophy, computer science and engineering. As an added feature, the Houghton Mifflin 4th Edition of The American Heritage® Dictionary of the English Language is embedded into all NetLibrary eBooks. Faculty, staff, students and other users can obtain dictionary definitions simply by clicking on a word in the eBook, or by entering a word in the dictionary search window.
