MESSAGE FROM GUATEMALA

Dr. Bartholomew sends this message "The people of Guatemala send their heartfelt thanks to Lancaster Theological Seminary for their generous contribution to the rebuilding of their broken lines and broken communities."

Here are some recent facts to get you up to date on the progress of restoration in Guatemala. Between now and the middle of April (before the rainy season begins) the United Nations Development Relief Organization and all other agencies are concentrating on housing. It will be necessary to rebuild at least 250,000 homes. The Church World Service has sent another Charter plane filled with tools, wheelbarrows, picks, shovels and plastic covering for roofing to Guatemala. The total request from the American churches has been \$2,000,000. It is to this that our seminary community has contributed.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

At its meeting on Thursday, March 25, 1976 the Executive Committee adopted the following policy statement:

1. Responsibility for scheduling of public events in Seminary facilities is assigned to the Office of the President (except for the use of the Chapel for worship, which is assigned to the Business Office)
2. Administrative responsibility for receiving and granting requests is lodged with the Assistant to the President, Edna Hafer.
3. As a matter of procedure she asks persons requesting use of seminary facilities to fill out a simple form.
4. If she has any questions about the validity of the request, she refers these matters to the Executive Cabinet for decision.
5. Meetings are recorded on the Master Calendar by Edna Hafer.

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE

We have jointly appointed the following Joint Committee on the 1976-77 Convocations: Dennis Hartman, Chairperson; Jim Moyer, George Bricker and Doug Whiting.
