McCauley Lecture, April 20, Hafer Center, 11:00 a.m. - FREE

Dr. David M. Mellott, Associate Director of Continuing Education and Assistant Professor of Theology will speak on "Ethnography as Theology: An Invitation for Theologians to Enter the Field" at this year's McCauley Lecture. Nearly twenty-five years ago, Aidan Kavanagh, a liturgical theologian, proposed to theologians and pastoral ministers to hit the streets and to find out what Christians are doing, how they are doing it, and what they are discovering in the doing. Unfortunately, few have taken up his challenge. Historians of religion, sociologists, psychologists, and anthropologists, however, are out in the field, in our communities, seeking to understand more fully the lived experience of Christians. They are studying Christians, who are handling snakes, flagellating themselves, seeking the intervention of a particular saint in heaven, or who have a relationship with and devotion to Mary through a specific apparition. Where are the theologians? Perhaps, if we hit the streets, we might learn something about our Christian companions, and ourselves.

This year's Harwick Lecturer Professor Katie Day of the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia will help you and your congregation respond creatively to issues of diversity and conflict in your congregation through this lecture and workshop.
