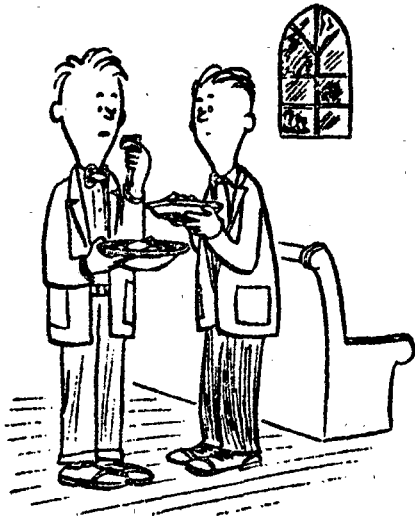

In case you're wondering.....so are the rest of us.

RE: The fireplace lounge in Richard's Hall

Gentlemen:

The concensus of the Student Body is that something positive be done with the fireplace lounge in the basement of Richard's Hall so as to provide for the Seminary Community (1) A place where people can go to study after the Library closes; (2) A place where people connected with the Seminary can congregate for relaxation and discussion (on an informal basis); (3) A room which can be suitably used to welcome and receive visitors on our campus; (4) A place where the Students can also utilize as a social room - for visitors as well as themselves; (5) finally, as a place which can be proudly displayed to everyone associated with the Seminary as being a beautiful community Lounge - and as a tremendous aid in helping to bring this community that much closer together.

Following is a recommended list of some of the materials needed to reach the ultimate objectives which are stated above:

- (1) Better lighting in the entire room (the present ceiling lights are inadequate) 3 floor lamps; 5 table lamps
- (2) The ceiling tile could stand to be replaced (if Possible)
- (3) Two large overstuffed couches
- (4) Six large overstuffed chairs
- (5) Two large tables (if we could get two from the refectory or ones like them - this would be great)
- (6) Curtains for the windows
- (7) The window sills need to be repaired - and the woodwork could stand to be sanded down and entirely refinished
- (8) One of the beautiful aspects of the room is the fireplace - new equipment would be needed
- (9) Two large oval rugs; 3 end tables; 2 coffee tables; 6 floor ash-trays
- (10) Repair bottom step - it is chipped
- (11) New paint on the walls above the paneling
- (12) Some of the windows need to be replaced - they are broken or cracked
- (13) Wire mesh covering on the rest of the windows for protection
- (14) New television set for this room
- (15) If possible and feasible - some nice paintings to be hung on the walls
- (16) Money to pay for making keys for this room

This room can be a great place for the community to meet in and take pride in - and I hope you can see your way clear to help us make this dream a reality.
