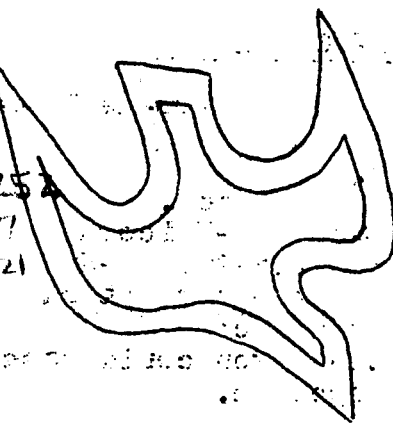

"MISCELLANY BEFORE MIDNIGHT"

This is a special invitation to the L.T.S. community and friends to attend an evening of Theatre --- "Miscellany Before Midnight", Tuesday, May 4, 1976, at 7:30 P.M. in the Hub basement/ L.T.S. campus.

The four productions to be presented are: The Mourners, by Bernard Malamud, which expresses the feelings of Jewish men and the meaning of their lives and deaths. Strangers In Town, by Shirley Jackson, portrays people on their home turf reacting to "alien foreigners" who invade their security. The third production, Excerpts From The Diary Of The Late God, is in the form of a press conference with God. This reading gives us a chance to ask the one question we've always wanted to ask, but were afraid to ask. These three productions were adapted for Readers Theatre by Dave Martin and Nancy Lilly. The final production of the evening will be Eugene Ionesco's, The Lesson. Ionesco's play gives us an opportunity and ability to observe the absurdity of man and his relationship to life. The Lesson concerns the education of a student by the professor.

The evening will be Readers Theatre style which is an expressive, dramatic art form of written literature giving the author's words the greatest emphasis. The evening will provide a new and exciting experience for L.T.S. Professor Robert Duke and the Religion and Arts class will provide you with an evening of art that has a message for man and his religious being.
