Recycling at LTS

Lancaster Seminary has many ways to help you responsibly handle your waste.

- ▶ Every room and office has separate receptacles for paper and trash. Please put clean, non-shiny paper only in the paper box.
- ▶ Every floor of both Lark and Schaff buildings is equipped with receptacles for glass and metal. Please put all cans and glass bottles in these receptacles.

Campus dwellers:

- ▶ Every apartment should have a green recycling pail to collect and carry metal and glass to the dumpster area. Do not put glass and metal in paper or plastic bags, except to transport it. The commingled container beside the dumpster is for glass and metal ONLY, no bags or plastic.
- ▶ Collect newspaper (NO ads or any other shiny newsprint) in brown paper grocery bags and deposit in the newspaper receptacle beside the dumpster.
- ▶ Computer paper, envelopes, notebook paper and letter paper, etc. should be collected in a plastic bag and deposited in the plain paper receptacle beside the dumpster.

It is very important to handle paper correctly as slight error can ruin the load. Paper cannot be recycled if it is wet or has wax or oil on it.

Place clean paper only in plastic bags (to keep it dry). Fill the bag completely before taking it to the dumpster.

A discovery/support group for women who are surviving emotionally abusive life situations has formed. "Abuse" is any behavior that is designed (intentionally or not) to control and subjugate another human being through the use of fear, humiliation, verbal and physical assaults. Emotional abuse is a pattern of behavior by a boss/co-worker, spouse/lover, parent, child or friend that demoralizes and destroys self-concept. It is often subtle and confusing. The most difficult ramification is that women come to accept the abuse as being their fault.
