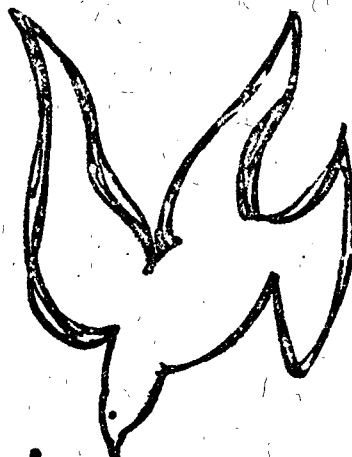
Here are a few which might titillate a somemnity of seminarians like us.
