



*Sharing the Peace of Christ

S. Minister: Peace be with you!

Many: And also with you!

During the Passing of the Peace the <u>Student Minister</u> goes to the Lectern and the <u>Reader</u> goes to the pulpit in preparation for the poem.

Poem

This week, as we hear the Gospel story of Jesus upending expectations as the child teacher, "The Hand" by Mary Ruefle invites us to explore the relationship between teacher and student. Who is teaching whom?

Reader:

The teacher asks a question. You know the answer, you suspect you are the only one in the classroom who knows the answer, because the person in question is yourself, and on that you are the greatest living authority, but you don't raise your hand. You raise the top of your desk and take out an apple. You look out the window. You don't raise your hand and there is some essential beauty in your fingers, which aren't even drumming, but lie flat and peaceful. The teacher repeats the question. Outside the window, on an overhanging branch, a robin is ruffling its feathers and spring is in the air.

Luke 2:41-52, New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)

Reader

Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him.

S Minister After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the

teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard

him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have

been searching for you in great anxiety."

Reader He said to them, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know

that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and

human favor.

Prayers of the Community

* The Student Minister immediately goes forward to the lectern and invites the assembly to prayer. Let them know they will be invited to voice their intercessions towards the end of this prayer:

S Minister Eternal God,

you are the maker of us all, and we are your creation, people formed in your image, as individuals, as community; formed and fed and furnished with understanding of who you are and of who and whose we are.

We are here because we have heard you speak in us and through others. Help us, dear Lord, to ever respond to you

and your invitation to your grace...

Many Lord hear our prayer...

Awaken us Lord, to hear what you would say to us. Help us to open our ears, our eyes, and our hearts to your presence. Help us to know when it is your voice we are hearing and when it is our prejudices and desires to which we are paying heed....

Lord hear our prayer...

Lord, we pray that your church may rise up with renewed commitment in answer to your call, that your people may be instruments of your grace and love....

Lord hear our prayer....

We pray, O Lord, for those in want and need – for those of us and of the larger community who suffer in body or in soul. And now we pause to remember before you...[wait for various intercessions]

Loving God, open our eyes to Emmanuel, to recognize you-with-us in the midst of all our moments, and to reflect the love of your beloved son to all your beloved people.

Lord, hear our prayer. Amen.

Offertory – The <u>communion presenters</u> bring forward the elements and place them on the table. <u>Presider and Student Minister</u> move to the table. The people will be invited to come forward at a later time.

*The Sacrament of Holy Communion

While the assembly is singing, the Presider and the Student Minister take their places at the Table.

As soon as the assembly finishes singing, the ministers proceed directly into the Eucharistic Prayer.

<u>The Student Minister</u> invites the assembly to stand.

S Minister The Lord be with you.

Many And also with you.

S Minister Lift up your hearts.

Many We lift them to the Lord.

S Minister Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Many It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Presider Worship and praise belong to you, God our maker.

Out of nothing, you called all worlds into being, and still you draw the universe to its fulfilment.

Day and night celebrate your glory

till time shall be no more.

S Minister In Christ, your only-begotten Son,

you have revealed yourself to the world.

By the guiding of a star,

you made him known to the nations as the son of David and king of Israel;

that in following him,

we might be led from darkness and into his marvellous light.

Presider As children of your redeeming purpose

who celebrate the manifestation of your Son

we offer you our praise, with angels and archangels

and the whole company of heaven

singing the hymn of your unending glory:

Many Holy, holy, holy Lord

God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

S Minister Glory and thanksgiving be to you,

most loving Father.

In Jesus the Messiah you have come to us.

Our hope is built on him in whom you are well pleased. Having been shown to the world

as your beloved Son,

he proclaimed the good news of your kingdom.

Presider Before he was given up to suffering and death,

desiring to complete the work for which he came into the world,

at supper with his disciples

he took bread and offered you thanks.

He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you."

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven.

Do this in remembrance of me."

Many We now obey your Son's command.

We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.

Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Presider Hear us, most merciful God,

and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Student Minister Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body

to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation,

we enter into our heritage

in the company of the apostles, and prophets,

and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Presider Through Jesus Christ our Lord,

with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory be to you,

Lord of all ages, world without end.

We use gluten-free bread and juice at this table.

Please join us for intinction at the foot of the stairs as you are able. Receive the bread and dip it into the cup.

Communion elements can also be served to you in your seat.

Those who would like an ecumenical prayer of blessing are invited to come forward to the preacher with your hand over your heart. Whoever you are and wherever you are on life's journey,

you are welcome here at this table where Christ is the host.
