scholar and New Testament
professor at DePaul University
in Chicago, will present the
1994 Ward Lecture and
Workshop on Thursday and
Friday, November 3 and 4.
The lecture, "Jesus, the
Peasant," will begin at 7:30
p.m. on Thursday, November
3 in the Santee Chapel.

"The Search for the
Historical Jesus" is the title of

the workshop on Friday,
November 4, from 9:00 a.m.
until 2:00 p.m. in Hafer
Center.

While the lecture is open
to the public at no charge,
there is a workshop fee of \$30
which is waived for Lancaster

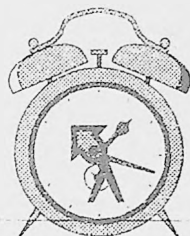
