

he Lancaster Theological Seminary, founded in 1825, is located directly across College Avenue from Franklin and Marshall College. The Seminary is affiliated with the United Church of Christ but is open to students and faculty of all denominations. Special emphasis is placed on preparation for the parish ministry.

The basic professional education program is a curriculum, usually completed in three years, leading to the degree of Master of Divinity. The Graduate Studies Program offers opportunity for pastors to pursue continuing study leading to the Master of Sacred Theology degree.

Ample opportunity is given Lancaster students to know the ministry and the world they will serve. Required September Seminars take the junior class into the widely varied parishes of the Mid-Atlantic area, the middlers into intensive human relations studies and the seniors abroad to see the work of the church in another culture. In addition, selected middlers may enroll in a parish training program for one full year of Seminary credit — working and living in a parish under the guidance of local clergy and the Seminary faculty. Nearly all seminarians share in the work and the worship of Lancaster area churches.

Five centers concerned with special theological educational methods are located on the Seminary campus. They are the Lancaster Case Method Project, the Lancaster Career Development Center, Unison of Lancaster, the Research Center for Religion and Society and the Laboratory for Leadership and Learning.
