- FCC-UCC PRAYER SUME IT TO BE HELD IN SANTER CHAPET TIME OF PRAYER AND TASTING RESCHIDULEC

On September 26 and 27 our Seminary community will have a unique opportunity to share in a very special worship experience. From 7:00 p on Wednesday the 26th through 5:00 pm on Thursday the 27th, the Pellowship of Charismatic Christians in the United - Church of Christ will be conducting a Prayer Summit meeting in Santee Chapel under the leadership of -- Rev. Ray Dringham, Director of Prayer Summit Ministries of Sacramento, California. This Binistry is engaged in uniting leaders and nations of the wor'd through prayer.

The Prayer Summit, the first such event of its kind to be held by the ECC-UCC, scheduled as an opening gethering and prelude to the seventh Annual Meeting of the FCC-UCC, which is scheduled for September 28-30 at the Church of the Apostles on Mariette Avenue. During the preyer meeting time has been provided for worship with prayer, praise and song, for ex-tended prayer time, and for teaching. Some of the themes to be emphasized are: "Deeper Life in the pirit," "Deeper Life in Pryer, and "Sesson of Intercession and Prayer Journaling." Along with Rev. Bringham, Leader --

One of the opportunities at LTS for a community deepening of the spiritual life is the time for Prayer and Pasting which was initiated last Spring. This is a very informal and unstructured time scheduled once a week in lantee Chapel for one hour during which members of the Seminary community may come, taking time out of their hectic schedules to go humbly, quietly and personally to the lord in worship and prayer.

Some members of our community have used this time to participate in a regular discipline of fasting, an aspect of the Christian life which is often maligned, or at best, ignored.

But the emphasis is on informal and unstructured. Fasting as a part of this week y experience is totally a matter of personal choice dependent only on the individual and guidance from the o'y Spirit. Indeed, each person should feel free to come and go as he or she pleases, and to spend as much or as little of the hour as is appropriate. The only focus of the Time of Preyer and Fasting is to provide a meaningful opportunity for the entire Cominary community to engage in individual end corporate spiritual renewal and rowth through prayer.
