SOME BASIC PRINCIPLES OF THE SPIRITUAL LIVE PART IV

God's invitation to us is always to greater unity with Himself and wifh each other.

Jesus prays: "The glory which thou hast given me I have gimen to them, that they may become perfectly one so that teh world may know that thou hast sent me and hast loved them even as thou hast loved me." (Jn. 17) That the work of God is a work of reconciliation among humakind is clear from Jesus' teaching in the sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7) in the Vine and the Branches (Jn. 15), and the totality of his announcing of the Good News.

But Jesus is not merely the announcer of the Good News. The Son of God comes in our flesh, Hi is the Good News itself. Through him, we are united to one another; in him, we are united to God. It is through the mystery of the cross brought alive in us by the power of the Spirit that the Father is accomplishing in us ever deeper unity. Dying on the cross is Jesus' act of totally emptying himself in response to the Father who has emptied Himself in the sending of His Son. It also is the act by which Jesus enters most deeply into the human arean as a participant. Nothing is more common to humanity than dying. And this experience of mortality has been shown to be creative of a sloseness with all other persons who share this most basic "fact of life." In Jesus' love for the Father and his love for us in this, his death, his closest moment to both, I see the perfect love, spoken of by Richard of St. Victor, the trinitarian love realized and shared. The Father's kenotic deed of love is received by a co worthy lover who is God. It is responded to by the Son in his emptying out in the flesh by death. This equal sharing of kenotic love is the co-loved, the Holy Spirit. Since all humanity is linked with Christ and with one another in him at this moment of experienced mortality, the Holy Spirit effects the communication of the Father's joy to all mankind so that we "who have deed with " Christ rise now to newness of life." This newness of life we share is the communitarian life of the Trinity.

Brought alive, I must affirm my radical sameness to all and enter the human arena as a participant. To the hungry, I come as one who begs each moment of existence; to the stranger, as a pilgrim; to the naked, as one who needs the cloak of mercy; to the prisoner, as God's forgiven enemy.
