Crossan to
Present
1994 Ward
Lecture
and Workshop
November 3 and 4

JOHN DOMINIC CROSSAN, noted biblical scholar and New Testament professor at DePaul University in Chicago, will present the 1994 Ward Lecture and Workshop on Thursday and Friday, November 3 and 4. The lecture, "Jesus, the Peasant," will begin at 7:30 p.m. on

Thursday, November 3 in the Santee Chapel.

"The Search for the Historical Jesus" is the title of the workshop on Friday, November 4, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. in Lark 206.

Born in Ireland, Crossan is co-chair of the Jesus Seminar, a group of 74 Bible scholars that has spent nine years assessing the Gospels. He is the author of several books including the best-selling, The Historical Jesus: The Life of a Mediterranean Jewish Peasant, and the award-winning text, The Cross that Spoke: The Origins of the Passion Narrative.

While the lecture is open to the public at no charge, there is a workshop fee of \$30 which is waived for Lancaster Seminary students, faculty and staff. However, there is a meal charge if you wish to have lunch.
