## PARKING REGULATIONS ON LTS CAMPUS

I have studied the parking situation as ticket-giver and as resident student. Together with several others who concur in general, I make the following suggestions for a final evaluation before permanent signs are installed.

- 1. The areas reserved for resident campus parking would be sufficient if cooperation were securred from visitors. (Red Sticker)
- 2. The three spaces reserved for the CPD are unnecessary, and they should be assigned to campus resident parking. (Red Sticker)
- 3. The spaces east of the Porch are adequate both for visitors to the Jeminary and to the CPD. (no sticker)
- 4. In cases of special need (eg. a woman who returns late to the campus, physical handicap, or the like) a campus resident be assigned the right to use parking on the West Lot. This would be by petition to the administrative cabinet. (Faculty and staff sticker)
  - 5. That more parking in the Pine Street Lot be secured by enforcement of the regulations with the residents of Mary Street. The construction of a fence without gates would render this far less convenient to them and might eliminate their parking.
  - 5. Parking permits issued to resident students would have to be renewed annually and the fee might be increased. Pine street Stickers should be issued annually as well. Faculty and staff stickers would be for longer terms (perhaps three years).

I feel that adoption and implimentation of these suggestions together with the existing procedures would make optimal use of the parking facilities of the seminary
