

Lent Meditation—Week 5

Committing to Live in Relationship with God

Invocation

God of relationship, God of Trinity, you flow through everything and you flow through us. We are so happy and grateful that you wish to always be in relationship with us. We invite you to open our hearts and souls as we look to the future with optimism.

Confession

Lord, as we near the end of this time of Lent, we know that the lessons will be hard and painful before Easter. The temptation might be to skip over the bad parts and jump straight to Easter. Be patient with us as we explore the idea that this complicated story has beauty and order and a plan. Help us to look to the future with compassion but also with thanksgiving in the lessons learned and optimism for a better tomorrow.

A time of silence

You are invited into a time of silence. This Lent, we **have looked** at how the Celtic knot can lead us into a Spiritual practice. **We have seen** how this type of drawing follows the flow of a design by going **over** and then **under** the lines that intersect it. We understand that this rhythm reflects our awareness of God. Sometimes we see God's presence plainly and sometimes we cannot see God anywhere. Even so, we continue in our relationship, trusting that we will be "over" again soon.

Notice how the final design has been laid over the ones before it. Notice how complicated the relationship between the designs is. Contemplate the complexity of the knots and how they describe the complexity of our relationships with God and with each other. **Yet each is true and beautiful.** Follow the designs as a prayer. Say "over" and "under" as you come to intersections. Contemplate how you see that kind of relationship in your life.

Perhaps you would like to make your own design. With a pencil, lightly draw a simple squiggle on the back, making sure that it overlaps itself at points. Now closely outline the periphery of the image as well as the inner loops. Now you can start at any point erasing and emphasizing the intersections – always going **over** and then **under**. Remember that this is also a prayer for us to be in relationship with God.
