- 22 (c) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL APPOINT AND DESIGNATE
23 PERSONS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION (5), TO SERVE AS
24 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES WITH RESPECT TO ANY COMPLAINT THAT IS
25 FILED ALLEGING A VIOLATION OF ARTICLE XXVIII OR THIS ARTICLE 45.
26 THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL APPOINT THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW
27 JUDGES IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:
- 28 (I) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF
29 THIS SUBSECTION (5), THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL APPOINT TWO

1 PERSONS WHO WILL COMPRISE A RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE TO
2 ASSIST HIM OR HER IN APPOINTING PERSONS AS ADMINISTRATIVE LAW
3 JUDGES UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (5). EACH APPOINTEE TO THE
4 RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE MUST HAVE BEEN AFFILIATED FOR AT
5 LEAST FIVE YEARS WITH A MAJOR POLITICAL PARTY. THE TWO MEMBERS
6 OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE SHALL NOT BE AFFILIATED WITH
7 THE SAME MAJOR POLITICAL PARTY.

8 (II) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THEIR APPOINTMENT BY
9 THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE MEMBERS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS
10 COMMITTEE SHALL SOLICIT, BY MEANS OF A NOTICE PLACED ON THE
11 WEBSITE OF THE SECRETARY, A LIST OF CANDIDATES TO BE CONSIDERED
12 FOR APPOINTMENT AS AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE.

13 (III) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE POSTING OF THE
14 NOTICE REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (5)(c)(II) OF THIS SECTION, THE
15 RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE SHALL POST ON THE WEBSITE OF THE
16 SECRETARY OF STATE A LIST OF THE CANDIDATES TO BE CONSIDERED FOR
17 APPOINTMENT AS AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE. BY ADDITIONAL
18 NOTICE PLACED ON THE WEBSITE, THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE
19 SHALL ALSO REQUEST PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THE CANDIDATES LISTED.

20 (IV) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE POSTING OF THE
21 NOTICE REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (5)(c)(III) OF THIS SECTION
22 REQUESTING PUBLIC COMMENTS, THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE
23 SHALL RECOMMEND TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE THREE CANDIDATES FOR
24 APPOINTMENT AS AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE.

25 (V) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE
26 RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE SUBMITS ITS RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE
27 SECRETARY OF STATE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (5)(c)(IV) OF THIS
28 SECTION, THE SECRETARY SHALL APPOINT THREE PERSONS FROM THE LIST
29 OF CANDIDATES SUBMITTED BY THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE TO
30 SERVE AS AN ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE. OF THE THREE PERSONS
31 APPOINTED INITIALLY, THE TERM OF OFFICE OF ONE PERSON APPOINTED
32 WILL BE TWO YEARS, THE TERM OF OFFICE OF ONE PERSON APPOINTED WILL
33 BE THREE YEARS, AND THE TERM OF OFFICE OF ONE PERSON APPOINTED
34 WILL BE FOUR YEARS. AFTER THE INITIAL THREE APPOINTMENTS ARE
35 MADE, THE TERM OF OFFICE OF PERSONS APPOINTED AS AN
36 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (5) IS THREE
37 YEARS.

38 (d) EACH ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE APPOINTED IN
39 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROCEDURES SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (5)(c) OF
40 THIS SECTION MUST BE AN ATTORNEY WITH AT LEAST FIVE YEARS OF
41 EXPERIENCE IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW.

42 (e) IF AT ANY TIME THE TWO MEMBERS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS
43 COMMITTEE ARE NOT ABLE TO AGREE ON A LIST OF THREE CANDIDATES TO

1 RECOMMEND TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE AS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION
2 (5)(c)(IV) OF THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY SHALL DISCHARGE THE
3 EXISTING RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE AND APPOINT A NEW
4 RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE FOLLOWING THE SAME PROCEDURES AS
5 SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (5)(c)(I) OF THIS SECTION.

6 (f) EACH ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE APPOINTED PURSUANT TO
7 THIS SUBSECTION (5) IS AUTHORIZED TO ADMINISTER OATHS, EXAMINE
8 WITNESSES, ISSUE SUBPOENAS, RECEIVE EVIDENCE, CONDUCT HEARINGS,
9 AND EXERCISE ANY OTHER POWERS AND DUTIES THAT ARE DELEGATED TO
10 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES UNDER ARTICLE XXVIII OR THIS ARTICLE
11 45."
