SENATE COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AMENDMENT

Committee on Appropriations.

SB21-137 be amended as follows:

1 Amend printed bill, page 21, strike line 22 and substitute "program."

2 Page 21, strike line 27 and substitute "program."

3 Strike pages 22 and 23.

4 Page 24, strike line 1.

5 Page 24, before line 2 insert:

6 "(3) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$21,680,000 is appropriated
7 to the department of human services for use by the office of behavioral
8 health. This appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act,
9 the office may use this appropriation as follows:

10 (a) \$4,000,000 for the housing assistance program, which amount
11 is based on an assumption that the office will require an additional 1.0
12 FTE;

13 (b) \$1,600,000 for the recovery support services grant program,
14 which amount is based on an assumption that the office will require an
15 additional 1.0 FTE;

16 (c) \$50,000 for rural behavioral health vouchers;

17 (d) \$3,250,000 for mental health community programs for
18 unanticipated costs related to COVID-19;

19 (e) \$2,000,000 for mental health community programs for school-
20 based services for children and parents;

21 (f) \$200,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
22 recovery residence certification;

23 (g) \$3,530,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
24 unanticipated costs related to COVID-19;

25 (h) \$500,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
26 substance use screening, brief intervention services, referrals, and
27 supports;

28 (i) \$2,000,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
29 children and families;

30 (j) \$250,000 for treatment and detoxification programs;

31 (k) \$950,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
32 treatment in rural communities;

33 (l) \$950,000 for behavioral health crisis response system services;

34 (m) \$950,000 for criminal justice diversion programs for co-
35 responder programs;

36 (n) \$950,000 for community transition services for guardianship

1 services for individuals transitioning out of mental health institutes; and
2 (o) \$500,000 for community transition services for housing
3 assistance.

4 (4) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$3,900,000 is appropriated
5 to the department of public health and environment. This appropriation
6 is from the general fund. To implement this act, the department may use
7 this appropriation as follows:

8 (a) \$500,000 for sexually transmitted infections, HIV and AIDS
9 operating expenses;

10 (b) \$575,000 for school-based health centers;

11 (c) \$250,000 for mental health first aid training;

12 (d) \$575,000 for opiate antagonist bulk purchase; and

13 (e) \$2,000,000 for behavioral health disorders, which amount is
14 based on an assumption that the department will require an additional 1.2
15 FTE.

16 (5) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$690,000 is appropriated to
17 the department of human services for use by the office of early childhood.
18 This appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the
19 office may use this appropriation for early childhood mental health
20 services.

21 (6) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$120,000 is appropriated to
22 the department of law. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
23 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the
24 office of community engagement.

25 (7) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$500,000 is appropriated to
26 the department of higher education for use by the regents of the university
27 of Colorado. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash fund
28 created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
29 regents may use this appropriation for allocation to the center for research
30 into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support
31 strategies.

32 (8) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$4,425,000 is appropriated to
33 the department of higher education for use by the regents of the university
34 of Colorado. This appropriation consists of \$600,000 from the General
35 Fund and \$3,825,000 from the marijuana tax cash fund created in section
36 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the regents may use this
37 appropriation for allocation to the center for research into substance use
38 disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support strategies.

39 (9) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$900,000 is appropriated to
40 the department of higher education. This appropriation is from the
41 marijuana tax cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To
42 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for

1 allocation to the Colorado state university cooperative extension service
2 agrability project.

3 (10) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$112,179 is appropriated to
4 the department of health care policy and financing. This appropriation is
5 from the general fund. To implement this act, the department may use this
6 appropriation as follows:

7 (a) \$33,960 for use by the executive director's office for personal
8 services; and

9 (b) \$78,219 for medical services premiums, which amount is
10 subject to the "(M)" notation as defined in the annual general
11 appropriations act for the same fiscal year.

12 (11) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, the general assembly
13 anticipates that the department of health care policy and financing will
14 receive \$112,179 in federal funds to implement this act. The
15 appropriation in subsection (10) of this section is based on the assumption
16 that the department will receive this amount of federal funds to be used
17 as follows:

18 (a) \$33,960 for use by the executive director's office for personal
19 services and which is subject to the "(I)" notation as defined in the annual
20 general appropriation act for the same fiscal year; and

21 (b) \$78,219 for medical services premiums."
