

SENATE FLOOR AMENDMENT

Second Reading

1 Amend printed bill, page 12, after line 27 add:

2 "(C) FOR THE 2022 AND 2023 COMPLIANCE YEARS, EACH
3 QUALIFYING RETAIL UTILITY SHALL ISSUE ONE OR MORE STANDARD OFFERS
4 TO INTERCONNECT AND NET METER OFF-SITE, CUSTOMER-OWNED
5 DISTRIBUTED GENERATION AND SHALL RESERVE, FOR THIS PURPOSE,
6 CAPACITY EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF ONE PERCENT OF THE UTILITY'S
7 ANNUAL RETAIL SALES FROM THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING YEAR.
8 THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSION MAY SET LIMITS, BASED ON MARKET
9 DEMAND, ON ANNUAL MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM AVAILABLE CAPACITY FOR
10 NEWLY INSTALLED OFF-SITE DISTRIBUTED GENERATION THAT THE
11 QUALIFYING RETAIL UTILITY SHALL PLAN TO INTERCONNECT AND NET
12 METER. EXCESS ELECTRICAL OUTPUT FROM OFF-SITE DISTRIBUTED
13 GENERATION SHALL TAKE THE FORM OF A NET METERING CREDIT AGAINST
14 THE CUSTOMER'S ELECTRIC BILL AT THE ENERGY RATE APPLICABLE TO THE
15 CUSTOMER'S RATE CLASS, MINUS A REASONABLE CHARGE AS DETERMINED
16 BY THE COMMISSION TO COVER THE UTILITY'S COSTS OF DELIVERING TO
17 THE CUSTOMER'S PREMISES THE ELECTRICITY GENERATED BY THE OFF-SITE
18 RETAIL DISTRIBUTED GENERATION AND OF ADMINISTERING THE OFF-SITE
19 NET METERING CREDITS. THE COMMISSION SHALL ENSURE THAT THIS
20 CHARGE DOES NOT REFLECT COSTS THAT ARE ALREADY RECOVERED BY
21 THE UTILITY FROM THE CUSTOMER THROUGH OTHER CHARGES. THE
22 CUSTOMER MAY CHOOSE TO RETAIN OR SELL TO THE QUALIFYING RETAIL
23 UTILITY THE CUSTOMER'S RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDITS.

24 (D) AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION (1)(e)(I), "OFF-SITE" MEANS
25 LOCATED ON NONCONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OWNED OR LEASED BY THE
26 CUSTOMER."
