

## HOUSE FLOOR AMENDMENT

Second Reading

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 35, line 15, after "1-7.5-107.3," insert  
2 "**amend** (3) and (4)(a); and".

3 Page 37, after line 10 insert:

4 "(3) (a) If a bipartisan team of two election judges determines that  
5 the signature of an eligible elector on the self-affirmation matches the  
6 elector's signature stored in the statewide voter registration system, the  
7 election judge shall follow the procedures specified in section 1-7.5-107  
8 (6) concerning the qualification and counting of mail ballots.

9 (b) IN A COUNTY WITH TWENTY THOUSAND OR FEWER ACTIVE  
10 ELECTORS, IF A BIPARTISAN TEAM OF TWO ELECTION JUDGES DETERMINES  
11 THAT THE SIGNATURE OF AN ELIGIBLE ELECTOR ON THE SELF-AFFIRMATION  
12 MATCHES THE ELECTOR'S SIGNATURE STORED IN THE STATEWIDE VOTER  
13 REGISTRATION SYSTEM, THE ELECTION JUDGES SHALL FOLLOW THE  
14 PROCEDURES SPECIFIED IN SECTION 1-7.5-107 (6) CONCERNING THE  
15 QUALIFICATION AND COUNTING OF MAIL BALLOTS.

16 (4) (a) (I) An election judge shall not determine that the signature  
17 of an eligible elector on the self-affirmation does not match the signature  
18 of that eligible elector stored in the statewide voter registration system  
19 solely on the basis of substitution of initials or use of a common  
20 nickname.

21 (II) IN A COUNTY WITH TWENTY THOUSAND OR FEWER ACTIVE  
22 ELECTORS, A BIPARTISAN TEAM OF TWO ELECTION JUDGES SHALL NOT  
23 DETERMINE THAT THE SIGNATURE OF AN ELIGIBLE ELECTOR ON THE  
24 SELF-AFFIRMATION DOES NOT MATCH THE SIGNATURE OF THAT ELIGIBLE  
25 ELECTOR STORED IN THE STATEWIDE VOTER REGISTRATION SYSTEM  
26 SOLELY ON THE BASIS OF SUBSTITUTION OF INITIALS OR USE OF A COMMON  
27 NICKNAME."
