- 1 Amend the Energy and Environment Committee Report, dated March 9,
- 2 2023, page 1, strike lines 1 and 2 and substitute:
- 3 "Amend printed bill, page 2, strike lines 2 and 3 and substitute:
- 4 "SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-38.5-116, amend
- 5 (1) and (3)(b)(III); and **add** (3)(b)(VIII) as follows:".
- 6 Page 2 of the bill, strike line 7 and substitute:
- 7 "reporting repeal. (1) Legislative declaration. The general assembly 8 hereby finds and declares that:
 - (a) The industrial and manufacturing sector is one of the five largest sources of greenhouse gas pollution in the state;
 - (b) Industrial emissions often:
 - (I) Disproportionately impact low-income, minority, or housing cost-burdened communities in the state; and
 - (II) Contain hazardous air pollutants that cause or exacerbate existing health conditions, which, in turn, contribute further to the existing economic disparity between the disproportionately impacted communities and other communities of the state; and
 - (c) While state and federal regulation of industrial air pollution, including pollution from greenhouse gases, is essential for public health and for achieving state climate goals and addressing ozone nonattainment, voluntary actions are needed to achieve further reductions in industrial pollution.

(d) It is essential to control carbon dioxide because of its

IMPORTANCE IN DELAYING THE EXIT OF LONG-WAVE INFRARED RADIATION INTO THE NEGATIVE FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY DEGREES FAHRENHEIT VOID OF SPACE. WHILE ONLY FIFTY-FOUR PERCENT OF EARTH'S ENERGY IS MOVED THROUGH THE ATMOSPHERE VIA EVAPORATION, FORTY-SIX PERCENT OF ATMOSPHERIC ENERGY IS CARRIED AWAY VIA LONG-WAVE INFRARED RADIATION. WHILE TWENTY PERCENT OF LONG-WAVE INFRARED RADIATION PASSES THROUGH AN "ATMOSPHERIC WINDOW", EIGHTY PERCENT OF IT IS ABSORBED BY ATMOSPHERIC GASES, NEARLY TEN PERCENT OF WHICH IS DELAYED BY CARBON DIOXIDE. HUMAN ACTIVITY PRODUCES ONE PERCENT OF THAT BALANCE ANNUALLY, OF WHICH FIFTEEN PERCENT IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE UNITED STATES ALONE. THIS MEANS

THAT AS A WHOLE, THE UNITED STATES CONTRIBUTES

SEVEN-THOUSANDTHS OF A PERCENT TO ATMOSPHERIC HEAT ENERGY.

1 THIS MEANS ALMOST ONE PART IN TEN THOUSAND OF ATMOSPHERIC ENERGY IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE UNITED STATES, WITH EACH STATE CONTRIBUTING ONE TEN-THOUSANDTH OF A PERCENT, OR ONE PART PER 4 ONE MILLION ON AVERAGE VIA HYDROCARBON UTILIZATION FOR 5 MANUFACTURING, FOOD PRODUCTION, MINING, TRANSPORTATION, 6 HOUSING, COMMUNICATION, ENTERTAINMENT, ROCKET SHIPS, AND OTHER 7 USES. THIS WOULD REQUIRE APPROXIMATELY ONE MINUTE OF ADDITIONAL 8 CLOUD COVER EACH YEAR, MAKING THE BILLIONS AND TRILLIONS OF 9 DOLLARS EXTRACTED FROM TAXPAYERS NECESSARY TO SAVE THE PLANET 10 FROM SLIPPING INTO A CLIMATE APOCALYPSE.

(e) IN RECOGNITION OF THE ADDITIONAL PLANETARY RISK OF THE IMPACT OF INCREASED SOLAR IRRADIANCE SINCE THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION BEING THE EQUIVALENT OF SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-TWO BILLION BARRELS OF OIL, OR SIXTY-THREE MILLION HIROSHIMA-EVENTS PER YEAR, THERE IS NO TIME TO WASTE IN REINING IN A TRACE GAS THAT HAS PROLIFERATED IN LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED YEARS SINCE THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION FROM THREE MOLECULES IN TEN THOUSAND TO FOUR MOLECULES IN TEN THOUSAND, PUTTING US ON A DANGEROUS PATH TO THE SEVENTY MOLECULES PER TEN THOUSAND OF PREHISTORIC BOTANICAL FLOURISHING. EVEN NOW, IN THE LAST FIFTY YEARS ALONE, LEAF MASS HAS INCREASED BY OVER FORTY PERCENT IN ARID AND SEMI-ARID REGIONS DUE TO THE IMPROVED DROUGHT RESISTANCE; THIS UNCHECKED GROWTH MUST NOT CONTINUE IF EARTH IS TO SURVIVE. FOR THE GREATER GOOD, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THEREFORE DECLARES THAT COLORADO MUST LEAD THE WAY WITH THE MORAL FORTITUDE TO PUMP BILLIONS OF DOLLARS OF TAXPAYER MONEY ANNUALLY INTO THE GROUND TO PROTECT THE PLANET FROM AN INVISIBLE MOLECULE THAT IS ODORLESS, TASTELESS, AND FOUNDATIONAL TO ALL LIFE, TO STAVE OFF A CLIMATE FLUCTUATION PREDICTED TO BE A FRACTION OF A FRACTION OF ASSUMPTIONS AND CALCULATION ERRORS.
