

## SENATE FLOOR AMENDMENT

Second Reading

1 Amend the Appropriations Committee Report, dated April 26, 2023, page  
2 27, after line 16 insert:

3 **"29-32-116. Legislative Oversight Committee Concerning**  
4 **Affordable Housing and Homelessness - creation - duties.**

5 (1) **Creation.** (a) THERE IS CREATED A LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT  
6 COMMITTEE CONCERNING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS,  
7 WHICH IS REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "COMMITTEE".

8 (b) THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF SIX MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:

9 (I) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL APPOINT TWO SENATORS  
10 TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE, AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE  
11 SHALL APPOINT ONE SENATOR TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE; AND

12 (II) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL  
13 APPOINT THREE REPRESENTATIVES TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE, NO  
14 MORE THAN TWO OF WHOM ARE MEMBERS OF THE SAME POLITICAL PARTY.

15 (c) AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER THE CONVENING DATE OF  
16 THE SECOND REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-FOURTH GENERAL  
17 ASSEMBLY, BUT NO LATER THAN THE END OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION,  
18 THE SPEAKER, THE PRESIDENT, AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE  
19 SHALL EACH APPOINT MEMBERS TO THE COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO  
20 SUBSECTION (1)(b) OF THIS SECTION. THEREAFTER, THE TERMS OF  
21 MEMBERS APPOINTED OR REAPPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER, THE PRESIDENT,  
22 AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE EXPIRE ON THE CONVENING  
23 DATE OF THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE NEXT GENERAL ASSEMBLY,  
24 AND ALL SUBSEQUENT APPOINTMENTS AND REAPPOINTMENTS BY THE  
25 SPEAKER, THE PRESIDENT, AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE  
26 MUST BE MADE AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER THE CONVENING DATE,  
27 BUT NO LATER THAN THE END OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

28 (d) THE PERSON MAKING THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT OR  
29 REAPPOINTMENT SHALL FILL ANY VACANCY BY APPOINTMENT FOR THE  
30 REMAINDER OF AN UNEXPIRED TERM. MEMBERS APPOINTED OR  
31 REAPPOINTED SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY  
32 AND CONTINUE IN OFFICE UNTIL THE MEMBER'S SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

33 (e) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL SELECT THE FIRST CHAIR  
34 OF THE COMMITTEE, AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF  
35 REPRESENTATIVES SHALL SELECT THE FIRST VICE-CHAIR. THE CHAIR AND  
36 VICE-CHAIR SHALL ALTERNATE ANNUALLY THEREAFTER BETWEEN THE  
37 TWO HOUSES.

38 (f) THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE MAY  
39 ESTABLISH ORGANIZATIONAL AND PROCEDURAL RULES AS ARE NECESSARY  
40 FOR THE OPERATION OF THE COMMITTEE AND, IN COLLABORATION WITH

1 THE TASK FORCE CONCERNING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS  
2 CREATED IN SECTION 29-33-117, GUIDELINES AND EXPECTATIONS FOR  
3 ONGOING COLLABORATION WITH THE TASK FORCE.

4 (g) (I) MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE MAY RECEIVE PAYMENT OF  
5 PER DIEM AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES  
6 AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-2-307.

7 (II) THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
8 AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE LEGAL SERVICES SHALL  
9 SUPPLY STAFF ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMITTEE AS THEY DEEM  
10 APPROPRIATE, WITHIN EXISTING APPROPRIATIONS.

11 (2) **Duties.** (a) (I) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MEET AT LEAST THREE,  
12 BUT NO MORE THAN SIX, TIMES EACH YEAR AND AT SUCH OTHER TIMES AS  
13 IT DEEMS NECESSARY. ALL MEETINGS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE OPEN TO  
14 THE PUBLIC AND MUST BE RECORDED.

15 (II) EACH COMMITTEE MEMBER SHALL ANNUALLY EITHER ATTEND  
16 OR CALL INTO AT LEAST ONE REGULAR TASK FORCE CONCERNING  
17 AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS MEETING. COMMITTEE  
18 MEMBERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND SEPARATE MEETINGS AND INFORM  
19 THE REST OF THE COMMITTEE ABOUT THE CURRENT WORK OF THE TASK  
20 FORCE.

21 (b) THE COMMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OVERSIGHT OF THE  
22 TASK FORCE CONCERNING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS  
23 CREATED IN SECTION 29-33-117, AND SHALL SUBMIT ANNUAL REPORTS  
24 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(c) OF THIS SECTION TO THE GENERAL  
25 ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE TASK FORCE'S FINDINGS AND  
26 RECOMMENDATIONS. IN ADDITION, THE COMMITTEE MAY RECOMMEND  
27 LEGISLATIVE CHANGES THAT ARE TREATED AS BILLS RECOMMENDED BY  
28 AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE FOR PURPOSES OF ANY  
29 INTRODUCTION DEADLINES OR BILL LIMITATIONS IMPOSED BY THE JOINT  
30 RULES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

31 (c) (I) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 15 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMITTEE  
32 IS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND MAKE  
33 SUCH REPORT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE ON ITS WEBSITE; HOWEVER, DURING  
34 ANY INTERIM IN WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HAS SUSPENDED INTERIM  
35 COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES, THE COMMITTEE IS NOT REQUIRED TO SUBMIT  
36 SUCH A REPORT. THE ANNUAL REPORT MUST BRIEFLY SUMMARIZE THE  
37 STUDY ISSUES, RECOMMENDATIONS CONSIDERED, AND ANY ACTIONS  
38 TAKEN BY THE COMMITTEE AND THE TASK FORCE DURING THE PREVIOUS  
39 YEAR.

40 (II) THE REPORT MUST COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION  
41 24-1-117 (9). NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-117 (11)(a)(I), THE  
42 REQUIREMENT IN THIS SECTION TO REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY  
43 CONTINUES INDEFINITELY.

1 (d) AS NECESSARY, THE COMMITTEE MAY REQUEST PUBLIC  
2 TESTIMONY AND TESTIMONY AND REPORTS FROM STATE AGENCIES.

3 (3) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2027.  
4 BEFORE THE REPEAL, THIS SECTION IS SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW, ALONG  
5 WITH SECTION 29-33-117, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 24-34-104.

6 **29-33-117. Task force concerning affordable housing and**  
7 **homelessness - creation - membership - duties. (1) Creation.** THERE  
8 IS CREATED A TASK FORCE CONCERNING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND  
9 HOMELESSNESS, WHICH IS REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "TASK  
10 FORCE". THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF TWENTY-FIVE MEMBERS APPOINTED  
11 AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION AND ANY STAFF SUPPORT  
12 AS PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION 29-33-116.

13 (2) **Membership - terms.** (a) THE FOLLOWING NINE MEMBERS  
14 MUST BE APPOINTED ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2024:

15 (I) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL  
16 AFFAIRS SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE DIVISION OF  
17 HOUSING;

18 (II) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL  
19 AFFAIRS SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE DIVISION OF  
20 HOUSING'S OFFICE OF HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES;

21 (III) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE COLORADO HOUSING AND  
22 FINANCE AUTHORITY SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE  
23 AUTHORITY;

24 (IV) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
25 CARE POLICY AND FINANCING SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT  
26 THE DEPARTMENT;

27 (V) THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH  
28 ADMINISTRATION SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER REPRESENTING THE  
29 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION;

30 (VI) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF  
31 CORRECTIONS SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE  
32 DEPARTMENT;

33 (VII) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF  
34 EDUCATION SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT THE  
35 DEPARTMENT;

36 (VIII) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT  
37 EITHER THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT OR THE  
38 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; AND

39 (IX) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER TO REPRESENT  
40 EITHER THE COLORADO ENERGY OFFICE OR THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC  
41 DEVELOPMENT AND INTERNATIONAL TRADE.

42 (b) THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT  
43 COMMITTEE CONCERNING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS

1     CREATED IN SECTION 29-33-116, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE  
2     "COMMITTEE", SHALL APPOINT SIXTEEN ADDITIONAL MEMBERS.  
3     COMMITTEE STAFF IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PUBLICLY ANNOUNCING  
4     VACANCIES FOR THE FOLLOWING POSITIONS, AND REQUESTING  
5     CANDIDATES SUBMIT A LETTER OF INTEREST FOR THE SPECIFIC POSITION,  
6     SO THAT THE LETTERS OF INTEREST ARE DUE NO LATER THAN ONE WEEK  
7     AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION. THE LEGISLATIVE  
8     OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE, BY MAJORITY VOTE, SHALL APPROVE THE  
9     APPOINTMENTS FOR THESE POSITIONS. THE TASK FORCE MEMBERS TO BE  
10    APPOINTED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2)(b) INCLUDE:

11       (I) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A HOMELESS SERVICES  
12       PROVIDER IN AN URBAN AREA;

13       (II) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A HOMELESS SERVICES  
14       PROVIDER IN A RURAL OR RURAL RESORT AREA;

15       (III) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A FOR-PROFIT DEVELOPER OF  
16       AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING;

17       (IV) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A NOT-FOR-PROFIT  
18       DEVELOPER OF AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING;

19       (V) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A FOR-PROFIT DEVELOPER OF  
20       AFFORDABLE FOR-SALE HOUSING;

21       (VI) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A NOT-FOR-PROFIT  
22       DEVELOPER OF AFFORDABLE FOR-SALE HOUSING;

23       (VII) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A PROVIDER OF SUPPORTIVE  
24       HOUSING OR SUPPORTIVE SERVICES;

25       (VIII) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS AN OPERATOR OF  
26       MULTIFAMILY AFFORDABLE HOUSING;

27       (IX) ONE MEMBER FROM A LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN AN URBAN  
28       AREA;

29       (X) ONE MEMBER FROM A LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN A RURAL AREA;

30       (XI) ONE MEMBER FROM A LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN A RURAL  
31       RESORT AREA;

32       (XII) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING  
33       ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION;

34       (XIII) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS EITHER A HOMELESSNESS  
35       ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION OR AN ANTI-POVERTY ADVOCACY  
36       ORGANIZATION;

37       (XIV) ONE MEMBER WITH LIVED EXPERIENCE OF HOMELESSNESS  
38       WHO IS LIVING IN PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING AT THE TIME OF THEIR  
39       APPOINTMENT;

40       (XV) ONE MEMBER WHO, AT THE TIME OF THEIR APPOINTMENT, IS  
41       LIVING IN AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING THAT IS RESTRICTED TO EIGHTY  
42       PERCENT OR LESS OF AREA MEDIAN INCOME; AND

43       (XVI) ONE MEMBER WHO, AT THE TIME OF THEIR APPOINTMENT,

1 IS LIVING IN AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING THAT IS RESTRICTED TO ONE  
2 HUNDRED AND TWENTY PERCENT OR LESS OF AREA MEDIAN INCOME.

3 (c) BEGINNING ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION,  
4 MEMBERS APPOINTED TO THE TASK FORCE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION  
5 (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION SHALL SERVE NO MORE THAN THREE CONSECUTIVE  
6 TWO-YEAR TERMS, WITH THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY'S APPROVAL FOR  
7 EACH SPECIFIC TERM. WITH THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY'S APPROVAL, A  
8 MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE WHO IS SERVING ON THE TASK FORCE AS OF  
9 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION IS CONSIDERED TO BE BEGINNING  
10 THE MEMBER'S FIRST TWO-YEAR TERM.

11 (d) (I) A VACANCY OCCURRING IN A POSITION THAT IS APPOINTED  
12 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION MUST BE FILLED AS  
13 SOON AS POSSIBLE BY THE INITIAL APPOINTING OFFICIAL. IN ADDITION, THE  
14 INITIAL APPOINTING OFFICIAL MAY REMOVE AND REPLACE ANY  
15 APPOINTMENT THE OFFICIAL MADE TO THE TASK FORCE MADE PURSUANT  
16 TO SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION.

17 (II) A VACANCY OCCURRING IN A POSITION FILLED BY THE CHAIR  
18 AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(b) OF  
19 THIS SECTION MUST BE FILLED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE BY THE CHAIR AND  
20 VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIMITATIONS  
21 SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION. IN ADDITION, THE CHAIR  
22 AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE MAY REMOVE AND REPLACE ANY  
23 APPOINTMENT TO THE TASK FORCE MADE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(b)  
24 OF THIS SECTION.

25 (e) IN MAKING APPOINTMENTS TO THE TASK FORCE, THE  
26 APPOINTING AUTHORITIES SHALL ENSURE THAT THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE  
27 TASK FORCE INCLUDES PERSONS WHO HAVE EXPERIENCE WITH OR  
28 INTEREST IN THE STUDY AREAS OF THE TASK FORCE AS SET FORTH IN  
29 SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION; PERSONS WHO REFLECT THE ETHNIC,  
30 CULTURAL, AND GENDER DIVERSITY OF THE STATE; PERSONS  
31 REPRESENTING OF ALL AREAS OF THE STATE; AND, TO THE EXTENT  
32 PRACTICABLE, PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

33 (f) (I) ALL TASK FORCE MEMBERS ARE EXPECTED TO SEEK INPUT  
34 FROM THE VARIOUS NETWORKS OR ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURES OF THE  
35 BODY THEY REPRESENT, IF ANY. EVERY APPOINTING OFFICER IS  
36 ENCOURAGED TO NOMINATE A REPRESENTATIVE WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN  
37 MAKING TASK FORCE SUBJECT MATTER EXPERT RECOMMENDATIONS, YET  
38 STILL APPROPRIATELY REPRESENT THE RELEVANT STATE AGENCY.

39 (II) IN ORDER TO ADVANCE THE WORK OF THE TASK FORCE, TASK  
40 FORCE MEMBERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE IN DECISION-MAKING,  
41 WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT INDIVIDUAL VOTES ON TASK FORCE  
42 ISSUES ARE BASED ON SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTISE AND DO NOT COMMIT  
43 REPRESENTATIVE AGENCIES OR ORGANIZATIONS TO ANY POSITION OR

1 ACTION. TASK FORCE MEMBERS SHALL ADHERE TO ANY AGREED UPON  
2 PROCEDURAL RULES AND GUIDELINES.

3 (g) MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SERVE WITHOUT  
4 COMPENSATION. HOWEVER, MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE APPOINTED  
5 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION MAY RECEIVE  
6 REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES ASSOCIATED  
7 WITH THEIR DUTIES ON THE TASK FORCE.

8 (3) **Issues for study.** (a) THE TASK FORCE SHALL TRACK THE  
9 IMPLEMENTATION OF, IMPACTS OF, AND STATE EXPENDITURES  
10 CONCERNING THIS ARTICLE 33 AND LEGISLATION RELATED TO THE FINAL  
11 REPORT OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRANSFORMATIONAL TASK FORCE  
12 FROM FEBRUARY 2020, AND PROPOSITION 123 AS APPROVED BY  
13 COLORADO VOTERS DURING THE 2022 GENERAL ELECTION.

14 (b) THE TASK FORCE SHALL EVALUATE, REVIEW, AND MAKE  
15 RECOMMENDATIONS ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS  
16 POLICIES.

17 (c) IN EVALUATING THE ISSUES SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (3)(b)  
18 OF THIS SECTION, THE TASK FORCE SHALL SPECIFICALLY CONSIDER THE  
19 FOLLOWING RELATED ISSUES, INCLUDING:

20 (I) STATEWIDE HOUSING NEEDS AND GAPS AS IDENTIFIED BY THE  
21 STATE, REGIONAL, AND HOUSING NEEDS ASSESSMENT REQUIRED IN  
22 SECTION 29-33-104, INCLUDING ANY LOCAL, REGIONAL, OR STATE PLANS  
23 DERIVED OF THESE ASSESSMENTS;

24 (II) BEST PRACTICES FOR AND BARRIERS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING  
25 PRODUCTION AND PRESERVATION INCLUDING DEVELOPMENT AND LONG-  
26 TERM AFFORDABILITY STRATEGIES AND DISPLACEMENT MITIGATION  
27 MEASURES AS DESCRIBED IN SECTIONS 29-33-106 AND 29-33-107;

28 (III) BEST PRACTICES FOR STABILIZING CURRENTLY HOUSED  
29 INDIVIDUALS AT RISK OF ENTERING HOMELESSNESS;

30 (IV) STATEWIDE HOMELESSNESS ANALYSIS AS CONDUCTED BY A  
31 CONTRACTOR SELECTED BY THE OFFICE OF HOMELESS INITIATIVES WITHIN  
32 THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS;

33 (V) BEST PRACTICES FOR RESOLVING AND PREVENTING  
34 HOMELESSNESS;

35 (VI) THE ADMINISTRATION BY THE DIVISION OF HOUSING WITHIN  
36 THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS AND THE COLORADO HOUSING AND  
37 FINANCE AUTHORITY OF STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDS RELATED TO  
38 HOUSING;

39 (VII) THE IMPACT OF HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESSES ON STATE  
40 AGENCIES; AND

41 (VIII) THE IMPACT AND PROGRESS OF ANY LAND USE REFORMS,  
42 INCLUDING THOSE IN THIS SECTION, ON HOUSING AVAILABILITY AND  
43 AFFORDABILITY INCLUDING REVIEW AND RESPONSE TO ANY

1 RECOMMENDATIONS, ANALYSES, ASSESSMENTS, AND PLANS THAT ARE  
2 RELEASED BY THE MULTI-AGENCY COMMITTEE CREATED IN SECTION 29-  
3 33-103 AND USED TO IMPLEMENT LONG-TERM AND DEVELOPMENT  
4 AFFORDABILITY STRATEGIES AND DISPLACEMENT MITIGATION MEASURES.  
5 (d) THE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THIS SUBSECTION (3) DO NOT  
6 PROHIBIT THE TASK FORCE, AT ANY TIME DURING ITS EXISTENCE, FROM  
7 REQUESTING PERMISSION FROM THE COMMITTEE TO STUDY, PRESENT  
8 FINDINGS, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON ANY ISSUE RELATED TO THE  
9 SCOPE OF THE TASK FORCE AND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.  
10 (e) AS NECESSARY, THE TASK FORCE MAY REQUEST TESTIMONY  
11 AND REPORTS FROM STATE AGENCIES AND THE MULTI-AGENCY  
12 COMMITTEES CREATED IN SECTION 29-33-103, AS APPROVED BY THE  
13 COMMITTEE.  
14 (4) **Additional duties of the task force.** THE TASK FORCE SHALL  
15 ANNUALLY DELIVER POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE  
16 COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. IN ADDITION, THE TASK FORCE  
17 SHALL:  
18 (a) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1 OF EACH YEAR, SELECT A CHAIR AND  
19 VICE-CHAIR FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS;  
20 (b) MEET AT LEAST SIX TIMES EACH YEAR, OR MORE OFTEN AS  
21 DIRECTED BY THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE, SUCH MEETINGS MUST BE  
22 BOTH OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND RECORDED;  
23 (c) ESTABLISH ORGANIZATIONAL AND PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE  
24 OPERATION OF THE TASK FORCE AND FOR COLLABORATION WITH THE  
25 COMMITTEE;  
26 (d) DESIGNATE SPECIFIC TASK FORCE MEMBERS RESPONSIBLE FOR  
27 COLLABORATING WITH AND OBTAINING INPUT FROM OTHER GROUPS, TASK  
28 FORCES, OR STATEWIDE INITIATIVES THAT COMPLEMENT OR RELATE TO  
29 THE TASK FORCE'S IDENTIFIED AREAS OF STUDY;  
30 (e) CREATE NO MORE THAN THREE SUBCOMMITTEES AS NEEDED TO  
31 CARRY OUT THE DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE. THE SUBCOMMITTEES MAY  
32 CONSIST, IN PART, OF PERSONS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE TASK  
33 FORCE. SUCH PERSONS MAY VOTE ON ISSUES BEFORE THE SUBCOMMITTEE  
34 BUT ARE NOT ENTITLED TO A VOTE AT TASK FORCE MEETINGS.  
35 (f) STUDY THE IMPLEMENTATION OF COMMITTEE LEGISLATION  
36 PASSED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY;  
37 (g) UPON REQUEST BY A COMMITTEE MEMBER, PROVIDE  
38 EVIDENCE-BASED FEEDBACK ON THE POTENTIAL BENEFITS OR  
39 CONSEQUENCES OF A LEGISLATIVE OR OTHER POLICY PROPOSAL NOT  
40 DIRECTLY AFFILIATED WITH OR GENERATED BY THE TASK FORCE. THE  
41 FEEDBACK MUST BE DELIVERED WITHIN TWO WEEKS TO THE ENTIRE  
42 COMMITTEE AND REMAIN AS CONCISE AS POSSIBLE WHILE CAPTURING ANY  
43 AVAILABLE EVIDENCE. IF THE TASK FORCE CANNOT IDENTIFY EVIDENCE TO

1 EFFECTIVELY INFORM A RESPONSE, THE FEEDBACK WILL INDICATE A LACK  
2 OF EVIDENCE AND REPORT ON ANY ACTIONS TAKEN.

3 (h) (I) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1 OF EACH YEAR, PREPARE AND  
4 SUBMIT TO THE COMMITTEE, A REPORT THAT, AT A MINIMUM, INCLUDES:

5 (A) ISSUES STUDIED BY THE TASK FORCE, AS WELL AS FINDINGS  
6 FOR LEGISLATIVE OR OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS;

7 (B) LEGISLATIVE OR POLICY PROPOSALS OF THE TASK FORCE THAT  
8 IDENTIFY THE POLICY ISSUES INVOLVED, THE AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE FOR  
9 THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CHANGES, AND THE FUNDING SOURCES  
10 REQUIRED FOR IMPLEMENTATION;

11 (C) A SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE MEETING ACTIVITIES AND  
12 DISCUSSIONS;

13 (D) ANY EVIDENCE-BASED FEEDBACK PROVIDED TO THE  
14 COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4)(g) OF THIS SECTION; AND

15 (E) A SUMMARY OF EFFORTS MADE TO COMMUNICATE,  
16 COLLABORATE, OR COORDINATE WITH OTHER GROUPS, TASK FORCES, OR  
17 STATE INITIATIVES.

18 (II) THE TASK FORCE MAY POST THE REPORT ON THE COMMITTEE'S  
19 WEBSITE.

20 (5) **Coordination.** THE TASK FORCE MAY WORK WITH OTHER  
21 GROUPS, TASK FORCES, OR STATEWIDE INITIATIVES THAT ARE PURSUING  
22 ISSUES AND POLICY INITIATIVES SIMILAR TO THOSE ADDRESSED IN  
23 SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION. THE TASK FORCE MAY DEVELOP  
24 RELATIONSHIPS WITH OTHER TASK FORCES, COMMITTEES, AND  
25 ORGANIZATIONS TO LEVERAGE EFFICIENT POLICY-MAKING OPPORTUNITIES  
26 THROUGH COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS.

27 (6) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, THE  
28 TASK FORCE IS NOT REQUIRED TO MEET, SUBMIT ANNUAL POLICY AND  
29 LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS, OR SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE  
30 COMMITTEE DURING ANY INTERIM IN WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HAS  
31 SUSPENDED INTERIM COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES.

32 (7) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2027.  
33 BEFORE THE REPEAL, THIS SECTION IS SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW ALONG  
34 WITH SECTION 29-33-116 IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 24-34-104."

36 "SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, add
