Study: 27% of global catches go to non-direct human consumption

A scientist at Sea Around Us, a research project led by Daniel Pauly at Canada's University of British Columbia, has published research showing that 27% of global seafood catch go to non-direct human consumption.

The findings were published in in the journal Fish and Fisheries.

Researchers Tim Cashion, together with Pauly, Dirk Zeller and Fred LeManach, published their findings in the journal Fish and Fisheries.

The research found that 25% of global catches are destined specifically for the production of fishmeal and fish oil, and fishmeal demand --particularly from China -- keeps growing and exceeding supply.

90% of these fish are food-grade or prime food-grade, meaning they could be feeding humans instead.
