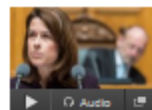

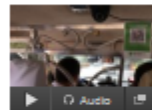

He found a surveillance state, and people who do not dare to talk freely.

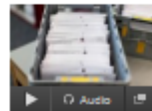
