



Typical headlines

Every layout is unique. Headlines should be carefully assessed for best results. Use these guidelines to best lay out your message.

FONT – Headlines should always be set in "Industry."

WEIGHT – For short, punchy headlines use Bold or Demi weight. For longer, multi-line headlines use Medium weight.

TRACKING – Headlines are typically tracked 20-40 pts.

LEADING – Headlines should have a line leading space of about 2/3 the cap height. This will ensure enough space for any ascenders and descenders as well as give it a nice compact feeling.

CAPITALIZATION – We have two headline styles that serve different purposes: all-caps and sentence case. Use all-caps for hero marketing messages that need to stand out the most. Use sentence case caps for longer form messages as well as for secondary headlines on a page.

LENGTH – All-caps headlines should be no longer than 15 words. Longer headlines should be set in sentence case. Sentence case headlines can be any length.

SIZE – The size of a headline will vary based on application. Generally we keep our headlines medium to small. We don't want to yell our message.

JUSTIFICATION – Headlines can be set left or center justified depending on each individual layout.



CAP HEIGHT Example of a sentence case headline used for longer messages or secondary headlines on a web page or catalog.

LONGER HEADLINE SET IN INDUSTRY MEDIUM

Short headlines

Short headlines make a big impact and are great when used as a wayfinding system or title system. Use these short headlines to increase visual hierarchy. Don't use these headlines to tell a story or message.

FONT – Headlines should always be set in "Industry."

WEIGHT – For short headlines use Bold or Demi weight

TRACKING & LEADING – Follow the same rules set on previous page.

CAPITALIZATION – These short headlines should always be set in all-caps.

LENGTH – Short headlines should be 1-4 words.

SIZE – The size of a headline will vary based on application, but unlike our typical headline, these are meant to be large and bold.

JUSTIFICATION – Headlines can be set left or center justified depending on each individual layout.


Eyebrows, floating callouts & subheads

Every layout should be carefully assessed for best results. Use these guidelines to best lay out your message.

EYEBROWS – Eyebrows live above headlines. Each is a short phrase introducing or giving context to a headline. They should be set in all-caps, "Soleto Bold," tracked out at about 20-40 pts. They should be between 1/3 and 1/4 the size of the headline.

SUBHEADS – Subheads are used to lead into longer form body copy to introduce and set up what readers will read next. They should be set in all-caps, "Soleto Bold," tracked out at about 20-40 pts at roughly the same pt size as the body copy.

FLOATING CALLOUTS – Floating callouts are unattached to body copy or headlines and should be self-contained bits of information. These are sometimes used to call out URLs, product specs or important information. They should be set in "Soleto Bold" or "Soleto Medium" in all-caps but at a size similar to or slightly larger than a subheadline. Think of these as very little headlines.





Body copy and in-text callouts

Every layout should be carefully assessed for best results. Use these guidelines to best lay out your message.

BODY COPY – Long-form body copy should be set in "Soleto Light" or "Soleto Regular." On rare occasion, when set over a background with less contrast, you can use "Soleto Regular" for a slightly heavier weight and improved legibility.

The copy tracking should not exceed 20 pts, and the line leading should be roughly a 1:1 ratio of cap height to line spacing.

The size will vary based on application, but a rough guideline is: Print should be 8-12 pts and web should be 14-18 px.

CALLOUTS – In-copy callouts such as taglines, URLs or information that needs specific highlighting should be treated the same as body copy except two weights heavier. For example, if copy is set in "Soleto Light," then the callout should be in "Soleto Bold."

Primary brand color palette

Black, white and gray are at the core of all Mercury Marine brand touch points, from product design to web design to marketing materials.

Red is used on packaged Mercury
Precision products and is an accent
on select engines (see page 89).
Red is also acceptable as an accent
color in sales event advertising.

Clean, simple and timeless, these core colors are able to anchor the Mercury brand in its rich history while also leading it into the future. These colors should make up the bulk of all Mercury branded elements no matter the application.



Secondary color palette

At its core, Mercury is about connecting people to the water. And so, we believe that the colors of water should be reflected in our visual brand language. While there are endless hues and tones of water and the surrounding environment represented in our photography and videography, these four colors are our main accent tones used for marketing and branded communications.

Consistently using ownable graphic elements beyond logos, fonts and colors is an important component to creating visual brand recognition within our marketing communications.

It is important to note that not all graphic elements need to be used on every piece of communication. Only use when appropriate.

Mercury Flag

The "Mercury Flag" has been a branded graphic element for several years. This simplified update is intended to create a subtle accent that helps call attention to other important elements on the page, such as logos, URLs or even small subheadlines.

The flag should be anchored to the right side of a composition, and should bleed off the edge of a print layout. It should never overwhelm or dominate a design.

The flag is not intended to be used apart from the logo or a CTA. Nor should it be used to reverse out an image. 23° – The angle of the flag should be 23° to match the slope of our Mercury Marine logo. It can be used either direction.

Logo Lockup – The flag works great as a way to anchor the logo and draw attention to the mark.

CTA Anchor – As a way to draw attention to a key CTA, try using a small flag to anchor your line.

Mercury Flag Usage

The flag should utilize defined primary or secondary brand colors: black, white, red, blue, dark blue, teal and green. Use of the flag should be complementary to the colors and composition, supporting the overall feel of product or lifestyle images portrayed. The flag is not to be used as a disruptive violator.

Use the horizontal or stacked logo with the flag based on the composition and available space.


A call to action should never be placed in the flag. The copy should always precede it.

See page 60 for logo usage rules.



Long Flag – In compositions where the logo is in a wide space, the flag can be long. The long flag is the width of the "MERCURY" wordmark. The height is three times the height of the "MERCURY" wordmark.

The flag should be one "Y" width away from the logo, and the logotype should be centered vertically.



Short Flag – In tall and narrow or confined spaces, the flag should be short. The short flag is the width of the "GO BOLDLY" tagline. The height is three times the height of the "MERCURY" wordmark.

The flag should be one "Y" width away from the logo, and the logotype should be centered vertically.







CTA Flag – When using the CTA flag, it should equal 1/3 of the width of the text. The height is three times the height of the text.

The flag should be one character width away from the text, and the text should be centered vertically.


Mercury Tag

The "Mercury Tag" is a branded graphic element that features a white Circle M badge in a black band. It should appear in a composition with the Mercury logo or the words "Mercury" or "Mercury Marine." The tag should never be used without one of those three elements.

When used on marketing and brand collateral, this graphic element should be anchored to the top edge of the composition. It can shift from left to right side but should never touch the vertical boundaries. Placement of the tag should always be over a color or an image that is not dark in tone, allowing the tag to stand out.


The color band of the tag should always be black and the Circle M always white.





Mercury Tag – The tag should be 0.875" wide and 1.09" high when it appears on a letter-sized page (8.5 x 11). When scaling the tag up or down in different uses, the tag width should match the width of the "MERC" letters in the logo that appears in the same context. Its width and height ratio should remain consistent.

Tag Bleed – On printed material, the tag should bleed off the top edge. An additional bleed area will need to be added to the tag. DO NOT shift the tag upward to create a bleed. It has been carefully sized, and its width and height ratio should not be altered.

Mercury Flag in packaging design

The original "Mercury Flag" and the color red remain as integral elements in the packaging design of Mercury Precision Parts, Precision Lubricants and Precision Care products. The black on the left of the flag is used to designate Mercury while the red to the right identifies this as a Mercury Precision product.

Though the original flag is no longer being used in marketing and branded communications, it provides a recognizable graphic element to packaged goods and aids in easily identifying Mercury products on dealer showroom shelves.

Horizontal and vertical graphic line overview

We use horizontal and vertical lines around headlines and important typographic elements to create hierarchy, visual intrigue and anchor points. They should never distract or draw attention away from the message, but instead serve to increase visual hierarchy.

FREQUENCY – These graphic lines are designed to be used minimally, for hero headlines and important callouts. Do not overuse.

WHERE – Only use these graphic lines with our all-caps hero headlines, short headlines and the occasional floating callout.

COLOR – These lines can be created in any of our brand approved colors.

SIZE – Line width and height adjust according to the location and headline size.

Vertical line usage

We use vertical lines when dealing with left or right justified stacking headlines, subheadlines, callouts and CTAs.

The height of the line should be roughly the same height as the stacked type.

The width of the line varies based on the size of the headline block.

Do Not use on single-line headlines.

Do Not use for centered aligned type.

Do Not use vertical and horizontal lines together.

Do Not use with title or sentence case.

LINE HEIGHT AND WIDTH ON LARGE HEADLINES

Vertical lines should be roughly half the width of the character weight (x) on large headlines. And roughly 2x away from the headline.

X = WIDTH OF LINEWEIGHT IN LETTER FORM



LINE HEIGHT ON LARGE HEADLINES WITH SUBHEADLINES

Proper use of extending the vertical line beyond the headline is when locked up with a left aligned callout, CTA or subheadline

Vertical lines should be half the width of the letter form (x) on these smaller type elements. And roughly 2X away from the headline.

X = ROUGHLY THE WIDTH OF STANDARD LETTER FORM



Horizontal line usage

We use horizontal lines when dealing with center justified headlines or very short single-line headlines or callouts.

The height of the line follows the same formula as the vertical line, except horizontal.

The width of the line varies based on the size of the headline block. If it is a long, stacked centered headline it should be roughly 33% the width of the copy it sits under. If a short (few words), single-line headline it should extend to match the width of the headline.

Do Not extend a horizontal line beyond the headline **Do Not** use a vertical and horizontal line together. **Do Not** use with title or sentence case.

HORIZONTAL LINE SIZE

Horizontal lines should be half the height of the character weight (x) on headlines. And roughly 2x away from the headline.



HORIZONTAL FULL WIDTH LINES

Under short, single-line headlines, the horizontal line should extend the full width of the copy block.

HORIZONTAL LINE UNDER SUBHEAD

Under short, single-line sub-headlines, the horizontal line should extend to the first three characters of the subhead.

EXAMPLE OF LEFT JUSTIFIED SUBHEAD




CENTERED LINE UNDER A LONG HEADLINE

Horizontal lines under stacked, centered headlines should follow roughly the same line leading as the headline - see (x) for reference.

The width is determined by the width of the copy block. It should be roughly 33% of the total width of the copy block.

WHAT WE SAY

Everything we do and say should be a reflection of what our audience loves about boating. As a marine engine brand, products and specs will always be important, but the way they're referenced should ladder back to the experiences we power.

SAFETY FIRST

As a leader in the marine industry, Mercury
Marine takes pride in promoting safe boating
practices in our photography and videos.
In order to ensure that photography and
video from around the world can be used
appropriately, it is extremely important to
adhere to the following guidelines.

Personal Flotation Devices (PFDS)

If the photography or video clearly shows that the boat is underway, all passengers must be shown wearing a personal flotation device (PFD). Additionally, all children 12 and under must wear a PFD regardless of whether the boat is in motion.

APPROVED PFDS (FOR NORTH AMERICA; FOLLOW FEDERAL REGULATIONS IN YOUR REGION):

Type I: Offshore Life Jackets.

Geared for rough, open or remote water where rescue may take a while. These PFDs are bulky, but they provide the best buoyancy, are bright-colored and will turn most unconscious people face-up in the water.

Type II: Near-Shore Vests.

Calm inland waters, where a fast rescue is likely, is the intended environment for these PFDs. They will turn some – but not all – unconscious wearers to the face-up position. They are bulky, but less bulky than Type I PFDs.

Type III: Flotation Aids.

Suitable for various sports activities, these provide freedom of movement and are most comfortable for continuous wear. They are appropriate for locations and situations where a quick rescue is probable. They allow wearers to put themselves in a face-up position, though wearers may have to tilt their head back to avoid being face-down in the water.

Note: Most current Mercury photography utilizes Type III PFDs. Commonly referred to as "suspenders" or "fanny pack" PFDs, these are generally less obtrusive and still allow the model(s) in the boat freedom of movement and comfort.

EMERGENCY STOP SWITCH & LANYARDS

Equally important as all boaters wearing a PFD is connecting the engine stop switch to the driver. This is mandatory in all photography and video shoots when boats are in motion.

1ST MATE® MARINE SAFETY & SECURITY SYSTEM

Boaters featured in Mercury photography can also be shown using the 1st Mate system in place of a traditional mechanical engine stop switch and lanyard. The innovative system is an approved alternative to a corded switch that makes boating more convenient. In photography, be sure the 1st Mate wearable fob is visible on the driver, either in the included wristband or carabiner clip.

UNSAFE BOATING PRACTICES

Photography or video depicting unsafe boating practices, including (but not limited to) the following, will not be used in any Mercury communication:

- Unattended helm while engine is in operation
- Wake jumping (unless you are specifically shooting wakeboarding activity)
- Swimming near the engine and/or swim platform while the engine is running
- Sitting on the gunwales or inflatable tube while the boat is underway
- Possession of or drinking alcohol on the boat
- Overloading a boat beyond its passenger or weight capacity



We strive to capture the essence and experience of boating in our photography. To go beyond capturing a single moment or showing off a cool feature, and to tell a visual narrative that can be felt by the viewer. Huge, dramatic, quiet landscapes that bring scale and aspiration to the story. Intimate, visceral moments of raw energy, action and emotion. We use these ranges in scale to depict the full Mercury-powered boating experience.

This principle of telling a story through a series of lenses allows us to reach our many audiences and tap into what makes our boaters Go Boldly.

And while the product is always included, it is not always the center of the action or the largest subject of an image. We are trying to go beyond product-focused photography and showcase Mercury as a brand that enables the best on-water experiences.






EXPANSIVE WATERSCAPES

Discover the beyond

Superwide, remote landscape photographs paint a picture and provide an escape. A place to imagine. A way to feel what it is like to be on the water, free to explore, with endless opportunity.

These aspirational landscape photos should show off boating in its most ideal state. Landscapes should be beautiful and tranquil. Framing should be extremely wide. And the boat should be in the distance. Use higher elevations to provide a sense of scale. When possible, avoid all other signs of human life, allowing a very small boat to become the focus.















MEDIUM-DISTANCE ACTION

Power the passion

These medium-distance photos are best for capturing engine performance and appealing to recreational passions.

Framing should be close enough to see details of the boat and experience, but not so close to lose context of the environment. This will show off the high-end speed, agility, handling and tech features of our products. Find a mix of unique, dynamic angles and compositions to best show off the appropriate product attribute.

CLOSE UP AND INTIMATE

Emotion of the moment

This is where we get so close you can smell the water and feel the spray. These close-up photos are best for high-energy moments that elicit feelings of joy, excitement, passion and triumph. Our previous shots should feel like they were all building to this moment.

These should be very tight and close. Don't be afraid to crop off sections of boats, body parts and equipment. We are trying to singularly focus on one moment.

Try using a shallow depth of field to further focus our attention. This is a great time to show off specific product attributes as well as the character of hands and expressions of faces.








Photo editing considerations

When choosing images, keep in mind the Go Boldly message, the objective and location of the image, as well as the overall look and tonality of the campaign. These images should elevate and breathe life into the Mercury brand.

Also keep in mind the use of the image. Highvisibility images for advertising or marquee web use should be given special attention.

Here are a few things to look for:

- Check to see if the horizon is level.
- Make sure the image is not too dark or overly bright.
- How does the color feel? Make sure not to oversaturate the image.
- Can water and sky tones be improved? Is there opportunity for decreasing vibrancy?
- Clean up any busy elements in the background that may distract from the image. For example: birds, buoys, other boats, houses, powerlines or other objects on shore.
- Remove any debris or grime on the boat or engines.

Video capture

Video content represents one of the most powerful ways Mercury can connect with current and potential boaters. Each video should be approached with a clear understanding of the purpose, its audience and where it's going to live.

Footage captured for video assets should reflect the Mercury brand promise and capture the essence of Go Boldly. All video content should elevate the Mercury experience with an aspirational look and feel, and reflect the tone of the campaign.

BOAT FOOTAGE:

Favor dynamic shots with unique angles that show off the athleticism of the boat and engines. Generally, lighting should be warm and directional. That said, not every day on the water is sunshine and warmth. Sometimes the activity set or story benefits from gray skies or cooler temperatures.

Exactly like our photography section, capture a wide variety of distances, including extra-wide landscapes that highlight the freedom you have with Mercury, medium distances to show off the precision boating and speed of the boat, as well as supertight, high-action moments to show off power and craftsmanship. Capture a mixture of high-speed, slow-motion footage and standard frame rate footage to add drama and allow for flexibility in the edit.

LIFESTYLE FOOTAGE:

Depict moments in a stylized, cinematic way. Capture people almost candidly and voyeuristically. Stay away from silly and bring potency to all moments. Lighting should be warm, directional and energetic, avoiding anything that looks like a studio. Moments should feel natural – not staged or overly composed – and dynamic in movement. Capture close-up intimate moments and distant cinematic moments that show the world around us.

LIGHTING:

When possible, favor morning and late afternoon lighting for video footage. The soft, warm light creates an ideal shooting condition. Harsh midday light reflects off the water and creates hard shadows on people and products. Instead, use the strong midday light to capture bright, underwater footage.

STABILIZE THE VIDEO:

When shooting on a moving boat, use a Gimbal as a way to stabilize your video and create a smooth experience.

DIVERSITY:

The water is for everyone - all ages, genders and races. Mercury branded content should be representative of all groups of boaters and should portray boating as the inclusive activity that it is.

Video editing considerations

When editing video content, choose footage that best embodies Go Boldly. When piecing footage together, avoid predictable patterns. Include a variety of wide, medium and close-up shots. Vary the pacing of the shot lengths and frame rate. Be mindful of the video's overall energy and flow. All these things will help it feel dynamic.

VIDEO LENGTH:

Keep the audience and placement in mind when determining the length of the video. Be mindful of a viewer's typical attention span based on placement. Content should remain focused and engaging.

END CARDS AND GRAPHICS:

Every video should end on the Mercury logo + Go Boldly tagline lockup and MercuryMarine.com when possible. Brand typography should be referenced when creating any graphics or end cards.

COLOR:

The aesthetic approach to color and lighting we use for photography should be replicated in video. Focus on creating a mixture of warm, rich blue tones and occasionally use soft black-and-white footage to break it up.

MUSIC:

Music is an instrumental part of telling a narrative and bringing emotion to a video. Music can add a distinct tone and should be chosen carefully to make sure Mercury is represented in an energetic, elevated way. Choosing the right music is as critical as the video footage itself.

Motion Graphics Package

Consistently using ownable graphic elements is an important component to creating visual brand recognition within video content. The Mercury Marine motion graphics package was developed to provide a plug-and-play component for video content creation.

THE MOTION GRAPHICS TEMPLATE (MOGRT) files are located in the "Assets" folder of the graphics pacakge Zip file. The MOGRT files can be utilized in Adobe® Premiere Pro and work best when imported through the Essential Graphics panel. This adds the graphics template to the Essential Graphics panel and allows for easy access and placement within video timelines.

All templates are built in 4k, 16x9 aspect ratio with a toggle for 1080p to maintain consistency in sizing. The templates use the Mercury® brand fonts, Industry and Soleto. Both of those fonts are available on the Adobe Fonts website. Additionally, there is a MOGRT file in the package featuring brand color swatches. These swatches can be referenced for color values or sampled with color picker for use in motion graphics and videos.

For use with two lines of text. Horizontal line should be 1/3 width of total text width.

SAMPLE HEADLINE EXAMPLE HERE

LEFT JUSTIFIED HEADLINE WITH VERTICAL LINE

For use with two lines of short text, similar in length. Vertical line should be equal to the height of the two lines of text.

SHORT HEADLINE

CENTER JUSTIFIED SHORT HEADLINE WITH HORIZONTAL LINE

For use with two to three words, 15 characters maximum. Horizontal line should be equal to the width of the text.

EXAMPLE OF EYEBROW 1/3 SIZE OF HEADLINE

LEFT JUSTIFIED HEADER AND EYEBROW

For use when headlines warrant additional descriptor text. Maintain eyebrow character height at 1/3 size of headline character height.



For use at conclusion of a video and as a call-to-action or callout within a video. It can precede the Mercury logo slate or be used in conjunction with the logo slate. DO NOT use the left justified CTA text in conjunction with the logo slate.

Engine nomenclature

The following engine nomenclature policies are aimed at maintaining consistency in Mercury messaging. They apply to Mercury outboards and MerCruiser® products.

- 1. Engine horsepower appears as lowercase "hp" with no space between the horsepower number and hp: 115hp.
- 2. List horsepower from lowest to highest: 75, 90 and 115hp engines or 75 to 115hp engines.
- 3. There is no hyphen in V8 or V6.
- 4. When mentioning multiple engine configurations together, list the largest first whenever possible.
- Our four major outboard brands are Verado®, FourStroke, Pro XS® and SeaPro™.
 Never use the following references: Verado FourStroke, Pro XS FourStroke or SeaPro FourStroke.
- 6. When listing engine nomenclature, follow this order: displacement, engine technology, hp and engine brand. Follow this order even when all nomenclature is not included. Examples:
 - 4.6L V8 250hp Pro XS outboard
 - L6 400hp Verado outboard
 - 115hp FourStroke outboard
- 7. If listing Mercury or MerCruiser with engine nomenclature, put the brand in front: Mercury 4.6L V8 250hp Pro XS outboard.
- 8. AMS and CMS follow the SeaPro engine brand only when necessary: 4.6L V8 300hp SeaPro AMS or 4.6L V8 300hp SeaPro CMS.

Proper trademark usage examples

By properly using and displaying our trademarks and service marks (marks), we strengthen them and increase their value. If we misuse our marks, we could be diluting or weakening them.

Use of Mercury Marine marks may be prohibited, unless expressly authorized within your agreement with Mercury Marine.

If you do not have an agreement with Mercury Marine, your use of our marks may be trademark infringement.

When you use our marks in sentence structure, you should adhere to the following rules of trademark grammar, in both your written or electronic work:

- 1. The ® signifies that the mark is registered in the **U.S. Patent and Trademark office.** The [™] is used with trademarks of our company that are not registered. The SM is used with the service marks of our company that are not registered.
- 2. Only use the federal registration symbol ® when you are certain that the mark has been registered with the **federal government.** If you are uncertain, you can use the common law designation ™ instead.
- 3. You do not have to place the ®, ™ or SM on a mark every time it appears in the same publication. Place it on the title, subtitle, captions, or the first time it is used within a section.
- 4. A mark should be used as an adjective not as a noun.

The noun should be the generic identifier of the goods or services, such as Mercury® outboards, MerCruiser® sterndrives and Mercury Product Protection® warranty

INCORRECT: "I just bought a new Mercury." **CORRECT:** "I just bought a new Mercury outboard."

5. A mark should not be used in the plural form.

The generic identifier should be in the plural form. **INCORRECT:** "He has two MerCruisers on his boat."

CORRECT: "He has two MerCruiser sterndrives on his boat."

6. A mark should not be used in a possessive form.

INCORRECT: "Mercury's have black cowls."

CORRECT: "The cowl on my Mercury outboard is black."

INCORRECT: "Mercury's employees routinely go above and beyond for their customers."

CORRECT: "Mercury employees routinely go above and beyond for their customers."

7. Brunswick Corporation is the proper owner of the Mercury

Marine marks. Acknowledge Brunswick Corporation as the owner in the trademark legal line.

CORRECT: "Mercury and MerCruiser are registered trademarks of Brunswick Corporation and Mercury Product Protection is a registered service mark of Brunswick Corporation."

8. "Mercury Marine" is the proper name of our company.

Our name may be shortened to "Mercury" only after it's been used properly at the first mention in the section.

CORRECT: "Since 1939, Mercury Marine has been known for quality. In fact, Mercury is one of the most recognized names in the marine industry."







On engines, red is used as an accent color to add depth and distinction.
