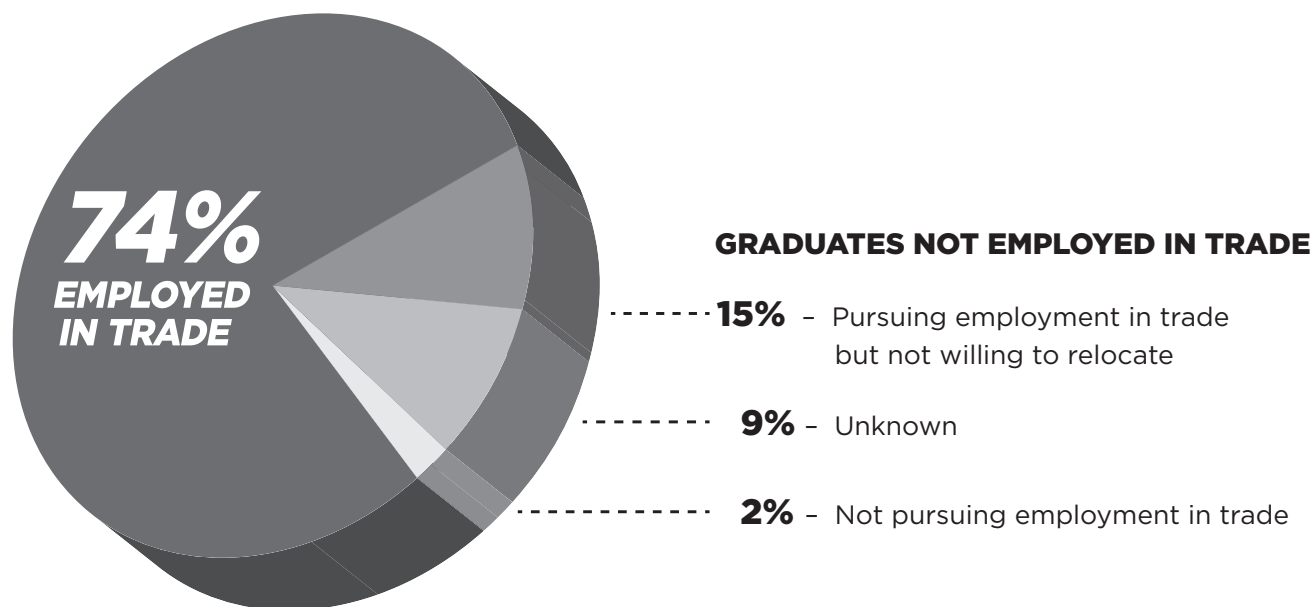
PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET INTRO

In this document, you will read and acknowledge the Performance Fact Sheet, as required by the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education. Northwest Lineman College is required to provide this information to you exactly as you see it, even though it only reflects a snapshot of the graduate employment rate (those employed within six months of graduation).

Northwest Lineman College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC). The ACCSC is an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. The following graph outlines the employment rate as reported to the ACCSC, and provides some additional information regarding our graduates, beyond just a six-month snapshot.

To determine the cohort date range, the calculation counts backward from the report date (July 1) as follows: program length times 150 percent, plus three months of employment activity.
