## Lesson 17

Read Mark 4:30 - 34

Introduction: "After teaching encouragingly about the kingdom, Jesus ends with a warning that the kingdom is like a mustard seed that grows to the point that birds lodge within its branches. Due to the fact nowhere in the world now or historically has a mustard seed ever grown a tree big enough to support birds and their nests, I believe Jesus is saying that as the kingdom grows, it will expand unnaturally in its organization and structure; that it will become bigger than it was ever intended to be, that birds – the Biblical symbol of evil – lodge therein. We see this in so many systems throughout church history, as complexity replaced simplicity and hierarchy swallowed liberty."
