Desperate Desiring

- Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity. Step 2 of the Twelve Steps
- "The God of old is still your refuge.
 This God has everlasting arms that can drive out the enemy before you." —
 Deuteronomy 33:27



- "Yes, we are carrying our own death warrant with us, but it is teaching us not to rely on ourselves, but on a God whose task is to raise the dead to life."
 —2 Corinthians 1:9
- "While he was still a long way off, the father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly." Luke 15:21

The surrender of faith does not happen in one moment but is an extended journey,

- ...we have to have three spaces opened up within us
 - our opinionated head,
 - our closed-down heart,
 - and our defensive and defended body.
- "Religion is lived by people who are afraid of hell. Spirituality is lived by people who have been through hell."



Opening Three Inner Spaces



- Need contemplative prayer (not reciting prayers) non-dual consciousness.
- Keep the heart space open
 - Healing hurts of the past; be in right relationships with people; & "right-brain" activities: music, art, dancing, fasting, life-affirming sexuality...; needs to be broken.



- Body remembers; importance of touch; incarnation (not Plato)
- So the work of spirituality is the ongoing liberation of head, heart, and body, toward full luminous seeing and living,





Reconnecting Head, Heart, and Body

• If we are to come to believe that a **Power greater than ourselves** can restore us to sanity,...by developing the capacity for a simple, clear, and uncluttered presence.



- letting life come at us on its own terms, and not resisting the wonderful underlying Mystery that is everywhere, all the time, and offered to us
- "God comes to us disguised as our life," Paula D'Arcy
- All we can do is **keep out of the way**, note, and weep over our defensive behaviors, keep our various centers from closing down...
