1. Provide an overview of the 12 steps initially - where they come from. Who uses them, how they are a spiritual program. 2. A summary of each chapter may be more helpful than quotes from scripture. 3. Pictures sometimes gave a negative description of concepts like powerlessness (a man drowning). Powerlessness is a positive that's when a person lets God in. 4. Working on the steps by oneself is not recommended. A person needs a sponsor or spiritual director as a guide. 5. AA has open meetings where anyone can go. There are specific meetings on the steps. 6. A relationship with a higher power is is essential in working the steps. Who is the God of Their understanding? 7. What's the goal for working the steps - to let go of addictions / attachments and to become the person God made you to be. 8. Anyone can purchase The Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, that explains the steps. Once a person is familiar with the steps -- then Rohr's book makes more sense. Thank you for putting this class together for our community. I appreciate your hard work.
