EXCHANGE SERVICE.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

To call the Central Office, remove the Telephone from the hook, and hold it to the ear, until an answer is received from the Exchange. Give the Operator the name of the Exchange and the number of the Subscriber's station required, giving the figures of the number separately, as "one-four-two-nine," instead of "fourteen-twenty-nine." Keep the Telephone to your ear, and the Operator will connect you with the party called for and ring his bell, unless his line is found to be busy, in which case she will notify you of that fact.

Answer the calls on your bell promptly.

Face the Transmitter with the mouth about one inch from the opening. Speak naturally, distinctly, and not too rapidly.

Do not use the Telephone during a thunderstorm.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

DESTROY PREVIOUS LISTS.

The right of the Subscriber is to use the instruments and connecting lines where the Company may place them, but not elsewhere, under such rules as the Company may from time to time prescribe. He shall not extend their use to other individuals, except his servants upon his business; nor shall they be used for any tolls or consideration to be paid by any person other than the Subscriber; nor does this confer on him the right to use any other instrument.

A Subscriber is not allowed to remove or otherwise interfere with the wire connections or parts of any Telephone apparatus leased from this Company.

Moving of Instruments.—The Telephone is first located by the Company where the Subscriber directs; if, afterwards, the instrument is required to be moved, such removal will be done by the Company at the expense of the Subscriber. Subscribers wishing their instruments moved will please fill out the blank form in the back of this book, and send it to the Local Manager. The instruments will then be moved as soon as possible.

Numbers.—Subscribers are requested not to advertise Telephone Numbers, but simply the word "Telephone," as it may be necessary to change such Numbers.

The use of profane or improper language over the lines is strictly forbidden.

Complaints regarding inattention on the part of employees of the Company, or of interruptions to Exchange service, should be made to the Local Manager. If the matter is not then satisfactorily arranged, notice should be sent to the District Manager, Calgary, the North-West Department Office, Winnipeg, or to the Head Office, Montreal.

LONG DISTANCE SERVICE.

Direct communication can be had between Cardston, Lethbridge, Magrath, Raymond and Stirling.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Connections outside the Local Exchange may be obtained by asking for "Long Distance."

Charges.—Regular tariff rates will be charged subscribers for each connection from their telephones to points outside the local exchange limits. When a conversation on toll line exceeds the time unit allowed, the extra charge for overtime will be added to the rate in all cases.

Where messenger has to be sent, the initial toll rate must be paid in addition messenger service, if party calling does not wait one hour for connection. If delay exceeds one hour, call may be cancelled on payment of messenger service charges.

When a particular person is desired, the name must be given to the Operator, otherwise charge will be made from the time connection is established with the Telephone desired, whether the party required is obtained or not.

Non-subscribers who desire the use of subscribers' telephones should be referred to the Public Stations of the Company.

Night Rates.—From 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. a Night rate, of about one half the Day rate, is in effect over the Long Distance lines of this Company. In no case is the Night rate to be less than 25 cents, unless the Day rate is less, in which case the Night and Day rates will be the same.

Written Messages of twenty words or less will be transmitted between Stations in Canada at the regular conversation rate (day or night). The regular minute overtime will be charged for each five additional words or fraction thereof.

Reversal of Charges.—All charges will be made against the originating office except those messages for which the receiving party expressly agrees to pay. The assent of the receiving party to a reversal of charge must be obtained **before** connection is established. No messenger charges shall be reversed.

Messenger Service.—Upon request, and the pre-payment of reasonable charges, a messenger will be sent when possible to notify a non-subscriber to come to any Public Station of the Company.

Complaints regarding unsatisfactory Long Distance Service should be made direct to the District Manager, Calgary, or to the North-West Department, Winnipeg.
