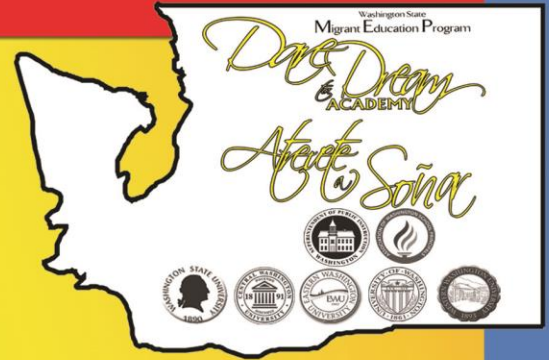
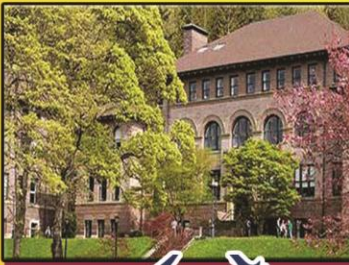

THE ACADEMIES The *Dare to Dream* and the *Math and Science Academic Academies* for eligible migrant students offer **ONE AMAZING RESIDENTIAL WEEK** at a university campus.

- **REGISTRATION, TRANSPORTATION, ROOM AND BOARD** are **FREE**
- **UNIVERSITY PROFESSORS** teach **HANDS-ON** interactive activities
- Rigorous and relevant **LEADERSHIP AND ACADEMIC PROGRAMS** promote student learning along with **SOCIAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES**
- **EARN A .5 ELECTIVE, MATH, OR SCIENCE CREDIT** by participating for the full duration of the academy
- **MENTORS**—former migrant students, now **College Assistance Migrant Program** staff are there every step of the way!

DARE TO DREAM ACADEMY (offered at all sites)

Designed for eligible 8th and 9th grade migrant students between the ages of 13 to 15.

Event Overview:

- **TEAM BUILDING** activities
- **EXPLORE** your leadership potential
- **PLAN** for high school: learn about local graduation requirements and offerings
- **EXPLORE** careers
- **DEVELOP A PERSONAL STATEMENT** to use for scholarships, jobs, internships and college applications
- **BUILD YOUR SUPPORT NETWORK** explore ways to share goals and aspirations with others—You are not Alone!

MATH OR SCIENCE ACADEMIC ACADEMY

(CWU and UW offer Science. EWU, WWU and UW offer Math)

Designed for eligible 10th and 11th grade migrant students who meet the other eligibility criteria.

Event Overview:

- **EXPLORE** the wondrous world of math or science
- **CHECK OUT** the local campus math and science programs
- **STRENGTHEN** your current math and science knowledge
- **LEARN** about math and science careers and job opportunities



Who is eligible to attend? Established by the Washington State Migrant Education Program, the *Dare to Dream and Academic Academies* participation is by invite only for migrant students who meet the following criteria:

- **HAVE MOVED** within the last 12 months
- **HAVE NOT** met standard on state assessments
- **ARE** credit deficient

How? A listing of eligible students is provided to the school district of PFS students that have been invited and includes eligible Needs students.

Why? Migrant students that attend may benefit from:

- learning skills and strategies to improve academics
- being inspired, challenged and nurtured through mentors and the relationship they develop with other migrant students

What if I already attended a *Dare to Dream Exploring Your Future Academy*? If you participated in *Dare to Dream Exploring Your Future* as an 8th or 9th grade student, you would not attend again. But if you are now a 10th or 11th grade student and are missing credits in math or science, you may benefit from attending.
