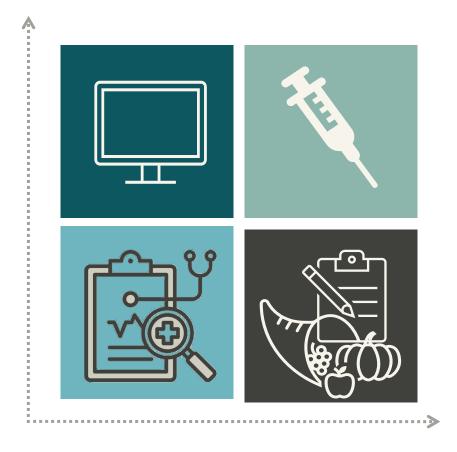

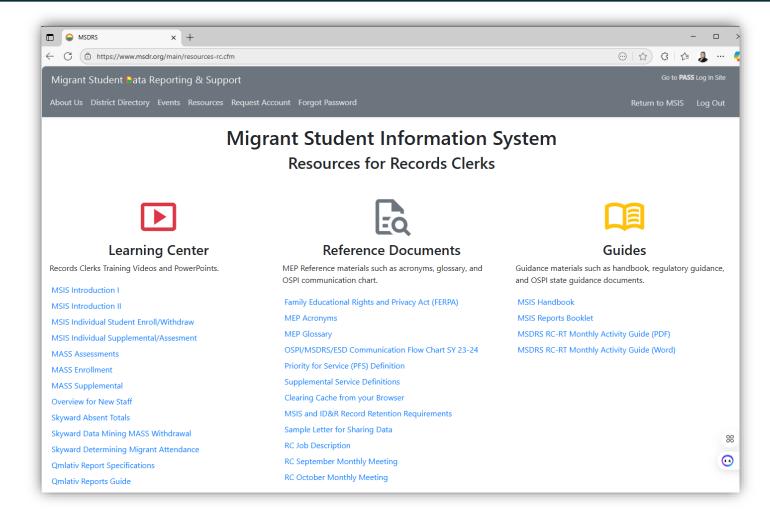

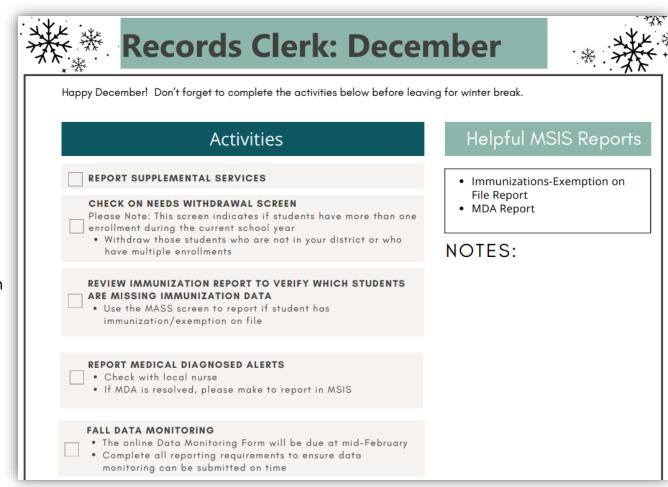

DEFINITION OF "SERVICES"

Services are a subset of all allowable activities that the MEP can provide through its programs and projects. "Services" are those educational or educationally related activities that:

- 1. directly benefit a migrant child;
- 2. address a need of a migrant child consistent with the SEA's comprehensive needs assessment and service delivery plan;
- are grounded in scientifically based research or, in the case of support services, are a generally accepted practice; and
 are designed to enable the program to meet its measurable outcomes and contribute to the achievement of the State's performant targets/annual measurable objectives.

The one-time act of providing instructional or informational packets to a child or family does <u>not</u> constitute a support service. Activities related to identification and recruitment activities, parental involvement, program evaluation, professional development, or administration of the program are examples of allowable activities that are <u>not</u> considered services. Other examples of an allowable activity that would <u>not</u> be considered a service would be the one-time act of providing instructional packets to a child or family, and handing out leaflets to migrant families on available reading programs as part of an effort to increase the reading skills of migrant children Although these are allowable activities, they are not services because they do not meet all of the criteria above.

Reporting Health Data

Health Reporting



Health reporting is the process for which student data regarding **health screenings**, **medical diagnosed alerts** and **immunizations** are updated on an ongoing basis.

The purpose for reporting health data is to ensure pertinent information is transferred from district to district to alert educators and health officials of student's health problems, which may interfere with a student's education.

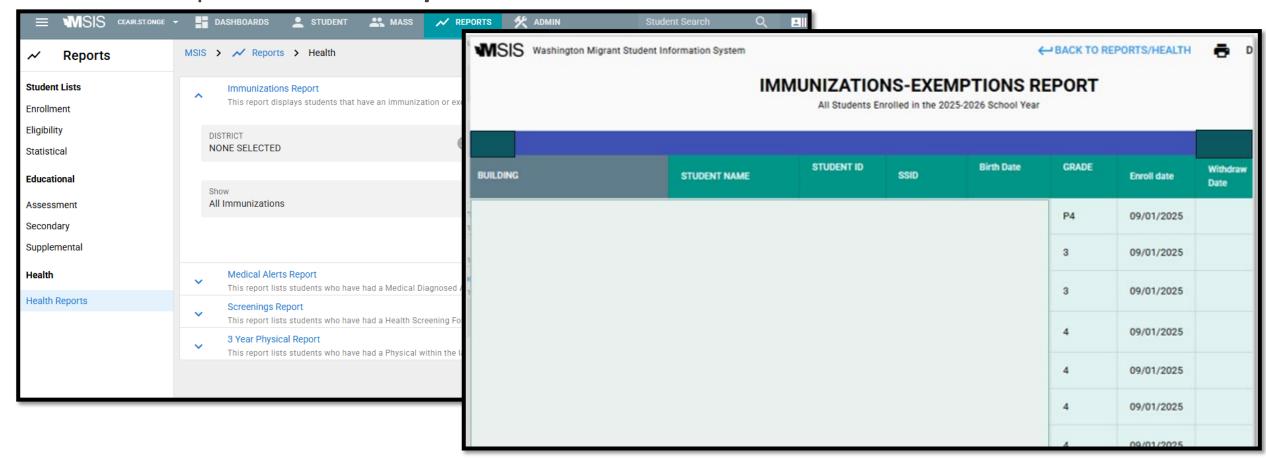
Reporting health data assists districts in demonstrating that they are supporting the unique heath needs of migrant youth and their families through allowable activities

Here are the steps to verify and report immunization

Additional Guidance on Immunization Reporting

Confirm access to each student's immunization information Status remains "on file" for the enrollment period Re-enrollment status remains "on file in same district New district verifies access and updates MSIS immunization tab Maintain separate list of students needing immunizations

- **1. Verification:** Verify that they have access to the immunization information "on file" for the students, regardless of whether the information is up to date, exempt, or needs updating.
- **2. Records On File:** Once "on file" is indicated for that enrollment period, no further changes are needed for the student's record for the rest of their enrollment period.
- **3. Withdraw/re-enrollments:** If a student is withdrawn and reenrolled into the same district, the immunization status will remain "on file."
- **3a. Example:** If the student is withdrawn from District A, e.g., Sunnyside, and enrolled in District B, e.g., Mount Vernon, the Mount Vernon records clerk will need to verify they have access to the student's immunization information "on file."
- **4. Update:** The immunization information tab in MSIS should be updated as soon as access is verified for student records purposes in MSIX.
- **5. Districts:** The district will need to maintain a separate list of students who may need immunizations or updates to their immunizations, as MSIS does not maintain a listing of students missing immunization information. It only verifies that the records clerk/district has access to this information within the district.

Reporting Medical Diagnosed Alerts (MDA)



- All Record Clerks can create and report MDAs in MSIS.
- If the district has a Migrant Nurse, the nurse may enter the MDA or collaborate with the RC.
- If there is no migrant-funded nurse the RC is responsible for entering all MDAs in MSIS.

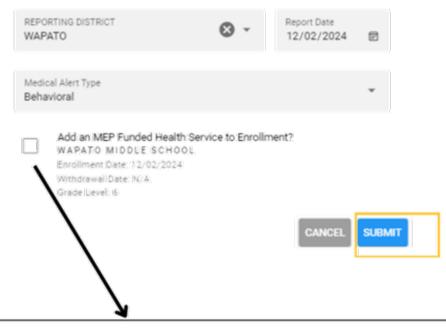

Reporting MDAs



- **1. IDENTIFY NEW MDA:** At the time of enrollment, districts need to capture any ongoing or urgent medical concerns so that these can be referred to health professional or provider
- **2. CREATE MDA:** The **person delegated** to entering health data (typically migrant nurse or migrant records clerk) should create the MDA immediately.
- **3. RUN MDA REPORT:** Run MDA report to see which students need to be identified for outreach. Establish a plan for resolving or alleviate ongoing health concerns.
- **3a. OUTREACH:** Whomever has been tasked with doing the outreach, calls all families to inquire if MDA is "ongoing", "unresolved" or "resolved".
- **4. RESOLVE:** After families have been called to inquire if MDA is "ongoing," "unresolved" or "resolved" work in coordination with Records Clerk to enter MDA data.
- **5. RUN MDA REPORT:** Run MDA Report regularly to capture new MDAs throughout the school year. Repeat Steps 3 and 4.

Out-of-School (OS) Enrollment

Enrolling students who have been re-engaged in their learning:

- 1. Withdraw as OS
- 2. Enroll in school building, if attending an Alternative Learning Environment (ALE), student would still be enrolled in the school which they would be attending if not attending an ALE.
- 3. If a student is not in an ALE or in a school building, they would still be noted as OS.

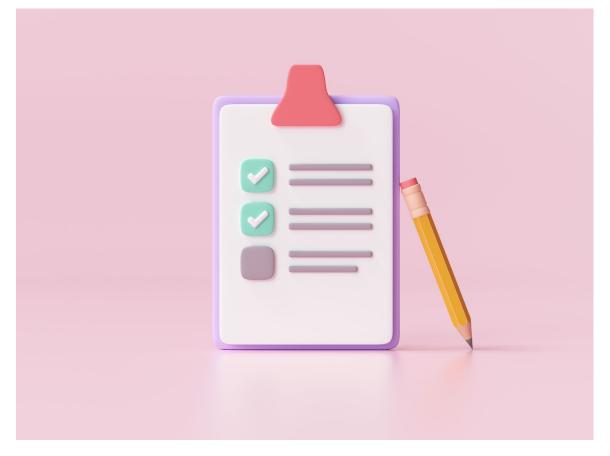

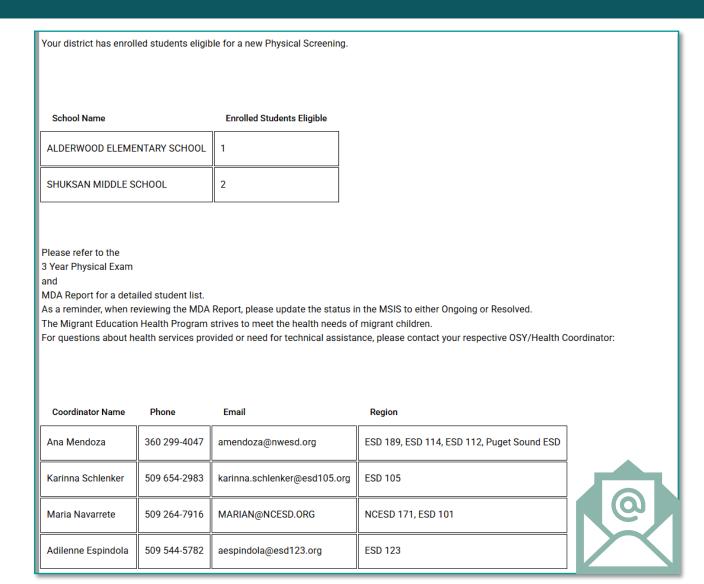

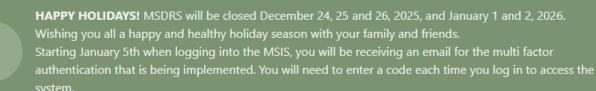

Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)

REMINDER: Effective January 5, 2026

To protect sensitive student data and maintain compliance with state and federal privacy requirements, all users will be required to complete multi-factor authentication (MFA) when accessing the Migrant Student Information System (MSIS) beginning January 5, 2026.

After entering your MSIS login credentials, you will be receiving an email for the multi factor authentication that is being implemented. You will need to enter a code each time you log in to access the MSIS.

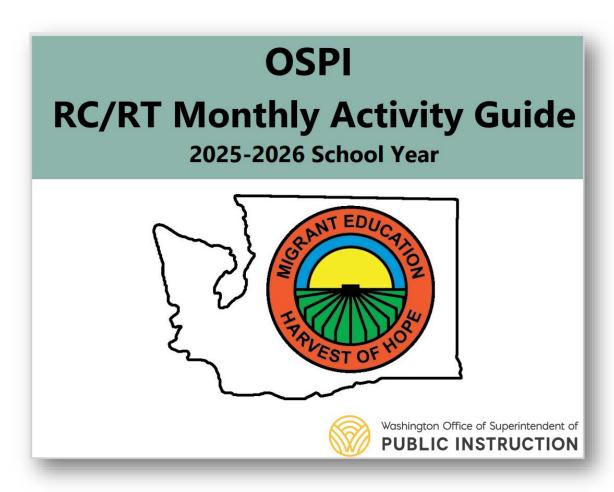
