RESOLUTION 2026-07**

**A RESOLUTION AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE CENTERVILLE
FEE SCHEDULE REGARDING REQUIRED VIDEO INSPECTION FEES FOR
STORM DRAIN AND SUBSURFACE DRAIN IMPROVEMENTS AND
FACILITIES**

WHEREAS, the City charges various fees for video inspection of storm drain systems and subsurface drain systems installed in association with development of property within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Section 19.060 of the Centerville Fee Schedule regarding video inspection fees for Storm Drain Systems to collect appropriate and reasonable fees for the cost of conducting such inspections; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Section 19.070 of the Centerville Fee Schedule regarding video inspection fees for Subsurface Drain Systems to collect appropriate and reasonable fees for the cost of conducting such inspections; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the amendments to the Centerville Fee Schedule are in the best interest of the City in order to assess and collect appropriate and reasonable fees for the cost of providing inspections.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of Centerville City, in the State of Utah, as follows:

SECTION 1: **AMENDMENT** “19.060 Storm Drains And Systems” of the Centerville Fee Schedule is hereby *amended* as follows:

The following video inspection fees shall apply to any newly installed or modified storm drain improvements or facilities. ~~Any person desiring to construct and/or install a storm drain or storm drain system within the City shall comply with applicable requirements set forth in CMC 15.05.050, CMC 16 (Stormwater), and other applicable ordinances, and shall be subject to the following fees.~~

1. Professional Services Fees. Applicants shall be required to pay the cost of required engineering, consulting, and/or legal services actually incurred by the City for a particular development or development application in accordance with CFS 19.040.
2. Minimum Video Inspection Fee. A minimum of \$200 video inspection fee shall be required.
3. Cleaning Prior to Inspection. All sediment, water, and waste material must be flushed and vacuumed out of the storm drain system or facilities prior to requesting video inspection by the City.
4. Re-Inspection. If the improvements and facilities need to be cleaned, repaired, or fixed due to any inspection failure, the developer is required to clean, repair, or fix the improvements and facilities prior to requesting a re-inspection. The developer shall be required to pay the re-inspection fee prior to City re-inspection.
5. Phased Inspection. The City may allow for phased inspections of storm drainage improvement, facilities, or systems as approved by the Drainage Supervisor. Phased inspection fees must be paid by developer prior to inspection.
6. Warranty Inspection. The City requires video inspection of storm drain improvements and facilities at the end of warranty as part of final inspection. End of warranty inspection fees must be paid by developer upfront with the Improvement Bond, if required, or prior to Building Permit, if no Improvement Bond is required.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT “19.070 Subsurface Drains And Systems” of the Centerville Fee Schedule is hereby *amended* as follows:

The following video inspection fees shall apply to any newly installed or modified public or private subsurface drain improvement or facility. ~~Any person desiring to construct and/or install a subsurface drain or subsurface drain system within the City shall comply with the submittal requirements set forth in CMC 9.06.050 along with the following fees.~~

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1. Professional Services Fees. Applicants shall be required to pay the cost of required engineering, consulting, and/or legal services actually incurred by the City for a particular development or development application in accordance with CFS 19.040.
2. Minimum Video Inspection Fee. A minimum of \$200 video inspection fee shall be required.
3. Cleaning Prior to Inspection. All sediment, water, and waste material must be flushed and vacuumed out of the subsurface drain system or facilities prior to requesting video inspection by the City.
4. Re-Inspection. If the improvements and facilities need to be cleaned, repaired, or fixed due to any inspection failure, the developer is required to clean, repair, or fix the improvements and facilities prior to requesting a re-inspection. The developer shall be required to pay the re-inspection fee prior to City re-inspection.
5. Phased Inspection. The City may allow for phased inspections of subsurface drainage improvement, facilities, or systems as approved by the Drainage Supervisor. Phased inspection fees must be paid by developer prior to inspection.
6. Warranty Inspection. The City requires video inspection of subsurface drain improvements and facilities at the end of warranty as part of final inspection. End of warranty inspection fees must be paid by developer upfront with Improvement Bond, if required, or with Building Permit, if no Improvement Bond is required.

SECTION 3: AMENDMENT “20.150 Videotaping Inspection Fees” of the Centerville Fee Schedule is hereby *amended* as follows:

1. Professional Services. Applicants shall be required to pay the cost of required engineering, legal, or consulting services incurred by the City for a particular development or application in accordance with CFS 19.040. ~~A minimum of \$700 shall be required for the Video Taping Inspection Fee provided herein. Sediment, and water material must be vacuumed out of the system prior to request for videotaping by the City. Fees for videotaping inspections are doubled to provide for a re-inspection videotaping if If subsurface drain improvements and facilities need to be repaired, or cleaned or for re-inspection at the warranty expiration date. If a re-inspection is not required or if the re-inspection only uses a portion of the collected fees, the remaining amount will be refunded to the developer. Final approval may be conditioned upon the applicant making full payment for professional service costs incurred by the City to that date.~~

SECTION 4: **REPEALER CLAUSE** All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Resolution full force and effect.

SECTION 5: **SEVERABILITY CLAUSE** If any section, part, or provision of this Resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6: **EFFECTIVE DATE** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon publication or posting or 30 days after passage by the City Council, whichever comes first.

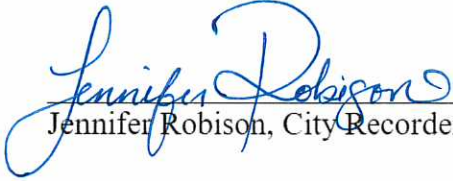

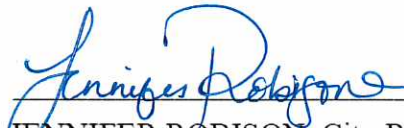
