**RESOLUTION AMENDING THE FEES FOR AMBULANCE SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, WAMC 5.03(7)(a) authorizes a fee to be charged whenever an ambulance of the City of West Allis shall convey a person; and

**WHEREAS**, the Common Council last amended EMS fees on December 12, 2023, by Resolution No. R-2023-0721; and

**WHEREAS**, the Center for Medicare announced a 2025 Ambulance Inflation Factor of 2.4% for 2024;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Council of the City Of West Allis, in the State of Wisconsin, as follows:

**SECTION 1:**        **AMENDMENT** “Fire” of the City Of West Allis Fee Schedule is hereby *amended* as follows:
