

## CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 2

A CHARTER ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND TO RECREATE THE CHARTER ORDINANCE  
PASSED MAY 17, 1938, AND APPROVED MAY 18, 1938, RELATING TO THE MANNER  
OF SELECTING THE CITY CLERK, CITY COMPTROLLER AND CITY TREASURER.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of West Allis do ordain as follows:

PART I. Section 1. The charter ordinance adopted May 17, 1938, and approved May 18, 1938 wherein the offices of City Clerk, City Comptroller and City Treasurer were made appointive by the Common Council is hereby repealed in so far as it provides for the appointment by the Common Council of the City Clerk and the City Treasurer. The provisions relating to the appointment and term of office of the City Comptroller in said Charter Ordinance are not hereby repealed but are to remain in full force and effect.

PART II. Section 2. The manner of selecting the City Clerk and City Treasurer shall be by election of the voters at the general city election held on the first Tuesday of April, 1944, and at the general city elections each successive fourth year thereafter in the same manner and subject to the same election and nomination laws applicable to other elected officials of the City of West Allis.

PART III. Section 3. The terms of office of the City Clerk and City Treasurer shall be for four years respectively or until their successors duly qualify. The first term to commence upon May 1, 1944, and the following terms to commence upon the first day of May each successive fourth year thereafter.

PART IV. Section 4. The present terms of the incumbent City Clerk and City Treasurer as provided for in the Charter Ordinance passed May 17, 1938, and approved May 18, 1938, are not hereby repealed but are to continue without interruption as provided in said charter ordinance and the appointment thereunder by the Common Council of the City of West Allis until their successors duly qualify under the foregoing sections and the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

PART V. Section 5. This is a Charter Ordinance and shall take effect sixty (60) days after its passage and publication, unless within such sixty (60) days a referendum petition as provided by section 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be filed, in which event this Ordinance shall not take effect until it shall have been submitted to a referendum of the electors and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
