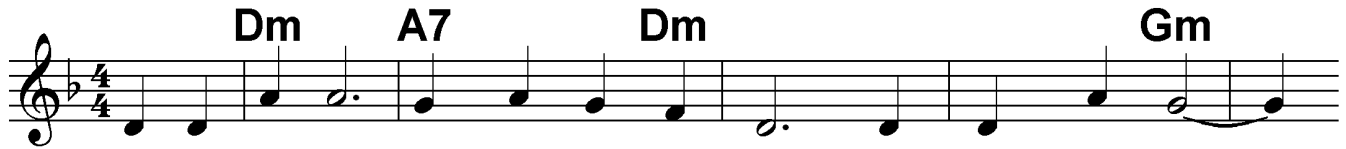


Wayfaring Stranger
