A specific plan is a planning document that guides the future development of a focused geographic area within a city. A specific plan typically contains:



Development standards that implement a city's general plan and vision for how it should evolve.




Goals and policies to help decision-makers recommend or approve new development projects.

The Burbank Media District Specific Plan is being updated by the City, in partnership with the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), to develop and implement policies and programs to:




Remove barriers to housing production



Streamline the permitting process




Introduce design standards for new development




The updated Specific Plan will foster a stronger jobs/housing balance within a safe, beautiful, and thriving community that embraces future mobility investments.

Specific Plan Components



Benefits of Multi-Family and Mixed-Use Development



MEETS HOUSING NEEDS

Multi-family development meets the housing needs of a variety of people – from families with retail jobs who cannot afford homes to senior citizens who no longer drive and want a smaller home to maintain.



CREATES SENSE OF COMMUNITY

The social nature of living in multi-family housing leads to a greater sense of community among residents of an area.



PRESERVES OPEN SPACE

Multi-family housing helps preserve open space and undeveloped land because it is less space-intensive than single-family housing.



INCREASES PROPERTY VALUES

Multi-family housing development contributes to increased property values of single-family homes as development impact fees are applied to creating and improving neighborhood amenities.



CREATES WALKABLE & BIKEABLE COMMUNITIES

Multi-family housing contributes to cities that are more walkable, bikeable, and transit accessible because housing is generally built along transit routes and close to key destinations.



INCREASES LOCAL TAX REVENUE

Multi-family housing efficiently increases local tax revenue that can be spent on neighborhood improvements, schools, and services.



SAVES WATER


On average, multi-family housing uses less water per unit and per capita than single-family housing.




CREATES MORE MOBILITY OPTIONS

Denser housing close to jobs increases demand for transit, which enables communities to bolster transit options and contributes to a commute mode shift from private cars to transit and active transportation.


