Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan

Project Overview

SANDAG and Caltrans District 11 are developing a Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan (CMCP) for Interstate 8 (I-8), named the Kumeyaay Corridor CMCP.

The Kumeyaay Corridor CMCP aims to guide the development of an innovative transportation network, transforming the way people and goods move through the central San Diego region. This CMCP evaluates all travel modes and transportation facilities in the study area using real-time travel data and incorporating public input. Completing the CMCPs will help the San Diego region compete for local, state, and federal funds, including Senate Bill 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017. The Kumeyaay Corridor CMCP is anticipated to be completed in late 2023.

Objectives and Planning

- » Identify the transportation needs of the people that live, work, visit, and travel through the study area
- » Gather input from the community to create solutions that integrate with current development and land use policies while promoting an innovative, resilient, efficient, and accessible multimodal transportation system
- » Create a plan that enhances economic vitality, fosters safe and healthy communities, and improves equitable access to jobs and education

Mission Valley Mobility Study

SANDAG, Caltrans, San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS), and the City of San Diego are also developing the Mission Valley Mobility Study. This study will focus on options that reduce vehicle miles traveled, while coordinating transportation improvements with major development projects underway in the area including SDSU Mission Valley and Riverwalk.


About CMCPs

In coordination with agency partners, SANDAG and Caltrans are developing II CMCPs. CMCPs are data-driven plans to reduce vehicle miles traveled and greenhouse gas emissions, provide transportation choices, and preserve community character while creating opportunities for neighborhood enhancement projects. CMCPs include all travel modes in a defined corridor and offer solutions to increase access for residents, commuters, visitors, and goods movement. CMCPs and their recommended projects strive to meet local, regional, and statewide goals for a safe, sustainable, accessible, and effective transportation system for the San Diego region.

The Kumeyaay Corridor study area is a two-mile wide eastwest transportation corridor that runs along I-8 and is located on traditional, ancestral, and unceded lands of the Kumeyaay people. The study area includes parts of the cities of San Diego, Santee, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, and El Cajon, as well as the County of San Diego. Major transportation facilities in the study area include I-8 and its connections with I-5, I-805, I-15, SR 163, SR 125, and SR 67, the MTS **Green and Orange Line Trolleys** and multiple MTS bus routes, as well as local roadways, bicycle, and pedestrian facilities.
